

AGRICULTURAL REFORMS WILL PAVE THE PATH FOR AN ATMNIRBHAR BHARAT

As nation is moving forward with fast pace under the dynamic and charismatic leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, almost every sector of the economy is experiencing transformation with crucial reforms revolutionizing every sphere of life. While the recent agricultural reforms have been welcomed in the entire country, some confusion created by certain vested interests have led a section of farming community to raise objections on few points. While the government is trying to convince this section by addressing their concerns, attempts are being made to politicise the process and block the dialogue process by raising intransigent demands. It is to be noted that any demand raised by keeping ulterior motives in mind has always failed in getting people's support in the country.

The Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion & Facilitation) Bill, 2020, The Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Bill, 2020, and, Essential Commodities (Amendments) Bill, 2020 are the three laws which were demanded by various stakeholders to reform the agricultural sector in the country. These reforms were discussed for long in the country and various farmer leaders, experts, political parties have been advocating these steps on various forums from time to time. The

passing of these laws have set the farmers free from the decades of bondage as now they can sell their farm produce to the buyers of their choice. Not only this, farmers are also free to sell their produce anywhere in the country. These laws have not only freed the farmers and gave them access to competitive market which can get them remunerative prices but also paved the path for modernisation of the agriculture sector with new technology, marketing and food processing infrastructure while involving them with trading and export activities. These are the reforms which will not only benefit the farmers immediately but empower them in the longer run as a strong component of Indian economy.

No one can deny the fact that the Modi government is the first government in India which has taken so many pro-farmer, rural-centric and agriculture friendly initiatives in the country. It is for the first time in the history of India that MSP has been fixed at one and half times more than the cost of production. Not only this, while the MSP has been continuously increased, it has been announced for many new crops and procurement has been historically high in the last six years creating many records in the country. It is for the first time in the history of India that with the introduction of neem coated urea now the

farmers are not compelled to wait in long queues and buy urea in black markets. The crop insurance scheme introduced by Modi government has given an immense sense of security to the farmers. Under the PM-KISAN, for the first time the farmers were given cash support through direct transfer of more than Rs. one lakh crore to their accounts till now. In addition to these, allied activities like fisheries, horticulture and dairy have received huge boost in a bid to increase farmers' income. The pro-farmer and pro-agriculture works of Modi government are so numerous that it may take volumes to elaborate on them in detail.

The Modi government is committed to the doubling of farmers' income, modernise agriculture and revolutionise the rural sector. It is highly unfortunate that certain vested interests in the existing system have tried to create confusion and mislead the farmers on ground of some baseless apprehensions to scuttle the reform process. But as the efforts are being made to address those confusions, concerns and apprehensions, the agitating farmers will very soon realise the necessity of these laws and support the agricultural reforms wholeheartedly. As the entire nation is supporting reforms in every sector, the agricultural reforms will pave the path for an Atmnirbhar Bharat building a 'New India' of 21st century. ■

PM CONGRATULATES KASHI FOR GETTING BACK STOLEN STATUE OF MATA ANNAPURNA

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi on November 30 participated in 'Dev Deepawali Mahotsav' in Varanasi. Addressing the event, the Prime Minister said it was another special occasion for Kashi as, he said, the idol of Mata Annapurna that was stolen from Kashi more than 100 years ago, is now coming back again. It is a matter of great fortune for Kashi. He said these ancient idols of our gods and goddesses are a symbol of our faith as well as our priceless heritage.

The Prime Minister said if such effort had been made earlier, the country would have got back



many such statues. He said, for us legacy means the country's heritage, while for some, it means their family and their family name. He added, for us heritage means our culture, our faith, our values! For others it might mean, their idols and family photos.

The Prime Minister said Guru Nanak Dev ji is himself as the biggest symbol of reforms in the society and system. He said whenever there are changes in the society and the national interest, the voices of uncalled for opposition arise somehow. But when the significance of those reforms becomes clear, everything gets alright. He cited

this as the lesson we get from the life of Guru Nanak Devji.

The Prime Minister said when development works started for Kashi, the protesters protested for the sake of it. He said when Kashi had decided that Vishwanath Corridor would be built till Baba's Darbar, the protesters had criticized that too, but today the glory of Kashi is being revived by the grace of Baba. He said centuries-long direct connection between Baba's Darbar and Maa Ganga is being re-established.

The Prime Minister expressed happiness that by the grace of the Lord Kashi Vishwanath, he got the opportunity to participate in the festival of light at Kashi. He recounted the glory of the ancient city and said that Kashi has guided the world over the ages. The Prime Minister said that due to the Corona restrictions he could not come to the city, which is also his constituency, very frequently and keenly felt the void created by this. He said he was never distant from his people during this time and kept tab on the arrangements during the pandemic times. He praised the spirit of public service displayed by the people of Kashi during the pandemic.

PM INAUGURATES SIX-LANE WIDENING PROJECT OF VARANASI-PRAYAGRAJ SECTION OF NH-19

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi during his visit to Varanasi on November 30 inaugurated six-lane widening project of the Varanasi - Prayagraj section of NH-19. Speaking on the occasion, the Prime Minister said we are now seeing the outcome of the work of connectivity alongwith the beautification of Kashi done in the past. He added that the unprecedented work has been done on new highways, pull-flyovers, widening of roads to reduce traffic jams in and around Varanasi.

The Prime Minister remarked that our farmers would benefit greatly when modern connectivity expands in the area. He said over the years, efforts have been made to create infrastructure like cold

storage alongwith modern roads in the villages. A fund of 1 lakh crore rupees has also been created for this.

The Prime Minister cited an example of how the farmers are benefiting from the government's efforts and modern infrastructure. He said

black rice was introduced 2 years ago in Chandauli to increase the income of the farmers. Last year, a farmer committee was formed and around 400 farmers were given this rice to grow in the Kharif season. While normal rice sells for Rs 35-40 a kg, this black rice was sold for up to Rs 300 a kg. For the first time, this rice has been exported to Australia, that too at the rate of around Rs. 800 per kg.

The Prime Minister said India's agricultural products are famous all over the world. He asked why farmers shouldn't have access to this big market and higher prices. He said new agricultural reforms have given farmers new options and new legal protection and at the same time the old system also continues if someone chooses to stay with that. He said earlier, transactions outside the mandi were illegal but now the small farmer can take legal action on the transactions outside the mandi also.



CRITICISM ON MERE APPREHENSIONS

The Prime Minister said Governments make policies, laws and regulations. Criticizing the opposition, he said earlier the decisions of the government were opposed but now the criticism is based on mere apprehensions. He said confusion is spread in society about what has not happened yet, which will never happen. He said these are the same people who have consistently tricked the farmers for decades.

Continuing on the duplicity of the past, the Prime Minister said MSP was declared, but a very meager MSP purchase used to take place. This deception went on for years. Large loan waiver packages were announced in the name of farmers, but they did not reach the small and marginal farmers. He added big schemes were announced in the name of farmers but earlier regimes themselves believed that out of 1 rupee, only 15 paise reached the farmer, which is deceit in the name of schemes.

The Prime Minister said when history has been full of deception, then two things are natural. The

first is that there is decades of history behind the farmers being apprehensive about the promises of governments. Secondly, it has become a compulsion for those who break the promises, to spread the lie that what used to take place before, is still going to happen. He said when you see the track record of this government, the truth will come out automatically. He said the Government delivered on the promise of stopping the black marketing of urea and giving enough urea to the farmers. He said the Government delivered on the promise of fixing MSP at 1.5 times the cost in line with the recommendation of the Swaminathan Commission. This promise was not only fulfilled on paper, but has reached the bank account of the farmers.

PROCUREMENT ON MSP INCREASED MANIFOLD

The Prime Minister said in the five years before 2014, pulses of around Rs 6.5 crores were procured from the farmer. But in the subsequent 5 years, pulses worth about Rs 49000 crore were procured,

that is, about 75 times increase. In the 5 years prior to 2014, paddy worth Rs 2 lakh crores were purchased. But in the subsequent 5 years, we have passed 5 lakh crore rupees as MSP of paddy to the farmers. That is, almost two and a half times more money has reached the farmer. He added in the 5 years before 2014, farmers got around Rs. 1.5 lakh crore on the purchase

of wheat. In the subsequent 5 years, wheat farmers have got Rs 3 lakh crores i.e. around 2 times. He asked why the Government would spend so much if the mandis and the MSP were to be dismantled. He stressed that the government is spending crores of rupees to modernize the mandis.

Criticizing the opposition, the Prime Minister said, these are the people who used to raise questions about PM Kisan Samman Nidhi, spreading the rumor that this money is being given in view of the elections and after the election the same money will have to be given back with interest. He added that in a state, where the opposition government

is there, due to its political interest, farmers are not allowed to take advantage of this scheme. He said assistance is being provided directly to the bank accounts of more than 10 crore farmer families of the country. So far, about 1 lakh crore rupees have been reached the farmers.

The Prime Minister said decades of deceit make farmers apprehensive but now there is no deceit, work is being done with intentions as pure as Gangajal. He remarked that the truth of those who spread illusions on the basis of mere apprehensions is being constantly exposed before the country. When farmers understand their lies, then they start spreading lies on another subject. He added the government is also constantly answering those farmer families who still have some concerns. He expressed confidence that those farmers who have some doubts on agricultural reforms today, will also take advantage of these agricultural reforms in future and increase their income. ■


I am confident that the people of Uttarakhand, the people of the country will continue to trust the Union Government led by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi

installments of Rs 500 were credited in the accounts of 20 crore women Jan Dhan account holders. Financial assistance of Rs 1000 was provided to the Divyang, widows and the elderly during the lockdown, while the farmers were given two installments of Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi Yojana. One lakh crore rupees were set aside for agricultural infrastructure development. Under the Kisan Samman Nidhi, an amount of one lakh crore rupees has been transferred to the bank account of farmers. Now the central government is implementing 'One Nation, One Ration

Card' so that ration can be easily available to the needy people anywhere in the country. Free food grains were supplied to 80 crore people for 8 months, which was a unique campaign in itself. A fund of 20 lakh crore rupees was sanctioned under the Self-Reliant India Campaign, out of which one lakh crore rupees were allocated for agricultural infrastructure and three lakh crore


The election was held on 150 seats of GHMC. However, none of the parties crossed the simple majority mark of 76 out of 150 seats.

BJP WINS 6 SEATS IN UP MLC ELECTIONS

Samajwadi Party won in two —Shri Maan Singh Yadav from Allahabad-Jhansi division and Ashutosh Sinha from Varanasi.

Shrishchandra Sharma from Meerut and Hari Singh Dhillon from Bareilly-Moradabad teachers’ constituencies.

SP’s Shri Lal Bihari Yadav won from Varanasi Teachers’ constituency and Independents Shri Akash Agarwal and Dhruv Kumar Tripathi won from Agra and Faizabad teachers’ constituencies, respectively. ■

SUCCESSFUL TEST FIRING OF BRAHMOS BY INDIAN NAVY

BrahMos Supersonic Cruise Missile in Anti-Ship mode was successfully test fired on December 1 at 0900 hrs against a decommissioned Ship. The test firing was carried out by Indian Navy. The missile performed highly complex manoeuvres and hit Bull's eye of the target.

BrahMos is the supersonic cruise missile jointly developed by DRDO and NPOM of Russia as a Brahmos Aerospace joint venture, which became Brahmos Aerospace Private Limited. The missile has established itself as a major force multiplier in modern-day complex battlefields with its impeccable anti-ship and land-attack capabilities with multi-role and multi-platform abilities and has been deployed in all the three wings of the Indian Armed Forces.



The first launch of Brahmos took place in 2001 and till date numerous launches have taken place from various ships, Mobile Autonomous Launchers and Su-30 MKI aircraft, making it a versatile weapon. ■

BANARAS LOCOMOTIVE WORKS (BLW) SURPASSED ITS OWN RECORD

Banaras Locomotive Works, Varanasi, has surpassed its own record of manufacturing 31 electric locomotives in a month, achieved in July 2020 with the turnout of the 40th 6,000 HP electric locomotive for the month of November 2020. This event is a historic record, achieved on the auspicious day of Dev Deepawali. This boost in manufacturing is a big contribution to AtmaNirbhar Bharat.

Despite COVID challenges, BLW has completely realigned its infrastructure to switchover from making diesel locomotives to electric locomotives.

The shift of the production line from Diesel to Electric Locomotives, at BLW, is in line with Ministry of Railways' multi-pronged strategy of lowering the fuel bill, reducing carbon footprint, reducing dependence on import of fuel and enhancing average speed and hauling capacity of trains.

Electric locomotive production is sourced from 98% indigenous components – substantial share is procured from Medium, Small and Micro Enterprises (MSMEs)

BLW is also working on a prestigious export order of 3000 HP cape gauge diesel locomotives to Mozambique. This has been put on a fast track. Under this order, for the first time 12 Cylinder Crankcase is being manufactured in BLW. ■

PM INAUGURATES MULTI STOREYED FLATS FOR MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on November 23 inaugurated Multi Storeyed flats for Members of Parliament through video conference. These flats are located at Dr B D Marg in New Delhi. Eight old bungalows, which were more than 80 years old, have been redeveloped to construct 76 flats. Speaking on the occasion, the Prime Minister said Green Building norms have been incorporated in this Multi Storeyed flats for the Members of Parliament. He hoped that these new flats will keep all the residents and the MPs safe and sound. He said accommodation for the Members of Parliament has been a long standing problem but it is now solved. ■

HEALTH MINISTRY'S TELEMEDICINE SERVICE E-SANJEEVANI COMPLETES 9 LAKH CONSULTATIONS

Since its rolling in November 2019, eSanjeevani AB-HWC completed over 1,83,000 consultations in a year

OVER 7,16,000 CONSULTATIONS RECORDED ON ESANJEEVANI OPD

In a landmark achievement, eSanjeevani, Health Ministry's national telemedicine initiative on December 2 completed 9 lakh consultations. The top ten States with highest consultations through eSanjeevani and eSanjeevaniOPD platforms are Tamil Nadu (2,90,770), Uttar Pradesh (2,44,211), Kerala (60,401), Madhya Pradesh (57,569), Gujarat (52,571), Himachal Pradesh (48,187), Andhra Pradesh (37,681), Uttarakhand (29,146), Karnataka (26,906), and Maharashtra (10,903).

Telemedicine is a new modality for remote diagnosis and treatment of patients over internet. eSanjeevani enables virtual meetings between the patients and doctors & specialists from geographically dispersed locations, through video conferencing that occurs in real time. At the end of these remote consultations, eSanjeevani generates an electronic prescriptions which can be used for sourcing medicines. In order to enable delivery of outpatient services remotely during COVID-19 pandemic as many as 28 States have on-boarded the Ministry of Health's eSanjeevani initiative. These States are aggressively working towards long term enablement of telemedicine services.

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has launched two variants of eSanjeevani namely - doctor to doctor (eSanjeevani AB-HWC) in hub and spoke model and patient to doctor (eSanjeevaniOPD). It has been one year now that eSanjeevani Ayushman Bharat-HWC was rolled out. Andhra Pradesh was the first State to roll out eSanjeevaniAB-HWC services in November 2019 and since then around 240 hubs and over 5000 spokes have been set up by various States. eSanjeevani AB-HWC has completed over 1,83,000 consultations.

public to seek health services remotely, it was rolled out on 13th of April 2020 during the first lockdown in the country. So far, over 7,16,000 consultations have been recorded on eSanjeevaniOPD that is hosting over 240 online OPDs which include general OPDs and speciality OPDs. Both the variants of eSanjeevani are rapidly evolving in terms of use and capacity and functionalities.

eSanjeevani Team at C-DAC Mohali is closely working with Ministry of Health to address the requirements of States. The Health Ministry is in regular touch with States to formulate strategies for extending the reach of eSanjeevani services to the underprivileged section of the society too. Few States like Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat etc., are experimenting various models to provision eSanjeevani services for non-IT savvy as well as poor patients who do not have access to the Internet. ■

RAIL ELECTRIFICATION GETS SUPER BOOST

A CRITICAL SECTION DIGHAWARA-BANDIKUI OF RAILWAY ROUTE BETWEEN AJMER TO DELHI HAS BEEN ELECTRIFIED

Shri Piyush Goyal, Minister of Railways, Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution on November 29 inaugurated newly electrified Dhigawara-Bandikui section of North Western Railway and flagged off first train on this newly electrified route at the function organized at Dhigawara station. Public representatives and senior railway officials were present on this occasion.

Speaking on this occasion, Shri Piyush Goyal, Hon'ble Minister of Railways, Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, Government of India said in his address that today is a very special day that we mark this day before the birth anniversary of Guru Nanak. He said that under the leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister, Indian Railways is moving forward in a phased manner with fast pace and quality and is making great achievements with everyone's cooperation, teamwork and motivation.

While emphasizing railway works, Shri Goyal said that the electrification work was done on the Kota-Mumbai line in Rajasthan 35 years ago, after that no one paid attention to this area. While working on this in the railways, a target has been set to electrify the entire percentage of railway lines across India. Talking about Rajasthan, he said that till 2009-14, there was 0 km of electrification work in this area which was 1433 km in the last five and a half years (till September 2020) i.e. 240 km route was electrified every year. He said that there has been a change in thinking over the years and there has been a change in the way we work. Today, after the electrification of this line, the route from Rewari to Ajmer has been electrified and now



the electrified trains from Delhi to Ajmer will start soon. After running of these trains, the diesel trains will be stopped, which will eliminate pollution as well as the dependence on the fuel imported from outside and

trains will be operated from the electricity produced in self-reliant India, this will also save significant revenue. Apart from this, the average speed of trains will increase and there will

THE distortions of Dharma that we now-a-days see all around us are largely the result of foreign education. The English word 'religion' has substantially contributed in distorting the pure meaning of Dharma. The British first heard the word when they came to India. They had no word of an equally comprehensive meaning. So they translated it as religion. Such translation has distorted the meaning of Indian words. Dharma is a very wide term which includes many religions. A religion a system of worship, and there are many such systems prevailing in this land. But in spite of these systems and sects Dharma is one. Dharma is that which is good for everyone irrespective of the system of worship and can open up for him the way to salvation.

DHARMA SUSTAINS WORLD

RELIGION means a creed, or a sect, it does not mean Dharma. Dharma is a very broad concept. It is concerned with all aspects of life. It sustains society. It sustains the whole world. That which sustains is "Dharma"

The fundamental principles of Dharma are eternal and universal. Yet their implementation may differ

according to time, place and circumstance.

The complete treatise on the rules in general and their philosophical basis is the meaning of Dharma.

These rules cannot be arbitrary. They should be such as to sustain and further the existence and progress of the entity which they serve.

FUNDAMENTAL OF CIVILISED LIFE

WE believe in Dharma not just because it is instrumental in acquiring Artha but because it is a fundamental principle of civilized life.

DHARMA GUIDES GOD

GOD cannot act contrary to Dharma. If he does, then he is not omnipotent. Adharma is a characteristic of weakness, not of strength. If fire; instead of radiating heat, dies out, it is no longer strong. Strength lies not in unrestrained behaviour, but in well-regulated action. Therefore God who is omnipotent is also self-regulated and consequently fully in tune with Dharma. God descends in the human body to destroy adharma and re-establish Dharma, not to act on passing whims and fancies. Hence even

God can do everything but act contrary to Dharma. But for the risk of being misunderstood, one can say that Dharma is even greater than God. The universe is sustained because, He acts according to Dharma.

NEITHER the Legislature is higher nor the Judiciary. Dharma is higher than both. The Legislature will have to act according to Dharma. Dharma will specify the limits of both. But even the people are not sovereign because people too have no right to act against Dharma. If an elected government allows people to go against Dharma and does not punish, then

that government is in reality a government of thieves. Even the general will cannot go against Dharma. Imagine the situation, if by some manoeuvring, thieves gain a majority in the government and send one of their ranks as an executive. What will be the duty of the minority if the majority is of thieves and elects a thief to rule ?

DHARMA RAJYA

IN our country we cannot think of any sentiment with which Dharma is not bound up. Hence we feel that our State cannot forsake Dharma. A secular State, in our opinion, does not mean a State without Dharma. The word Religion means a tenet in this country and those who believe it are called sects like the Jains, Shaivas and Christians. Naturally the State cannot belong to any of these sects. It must look on all with an equal eye. So we can say that a State is non-sectarian. This would be the ideal, but such a State, even without being partial to a particular sect or against some other sect, can encourage ways and means of achieving both material and spiritual progress and thus be called Dharma Rajya.

This religion is dynamic and living. It is not like a stagnant pool.

IF the four million people of Kashmir say that they want to secede, if the people of Goa say they want to secede and if some say they want the Portuguese to return, all this will be against Dharma. Of the 45 crore people of India, even if 449,999,999 opt for something which is against Dharma, even then this does not become truth. On the other hand, even if one person stands for something which is in accord with Dharma, that constitutes truth, because truth resides with Dharma. It is the duty of this one person that he tread the path of truth and change people. It is from this basis that a person derives the right to proceed according to Dharma.

Let us understand very clearly that Dharma is not necessarily with the majority or with the people. Dharma is eternal. Therefore, in the definition of democracy, to say that it is a government of the people is not enough ; it has to be for the good of the people. Dharma alone can decide.. Therefore, a democratic government "Jana Rajya", must also

be rooted in Dharma i.e. a "Dharma Rajya". In the definition of 'Democracy' viz. "government of the people, by the people and for the people", 'of' stands for independence, 'by' stands for democracy, and 'for' indicates Dharma. Therefore the true democracy is one where there is freedom as well as Dharma.

WRONG MEANING OF SPIRITUALISM

ONE of the main reasons for looking to the West for a solution to economic problems is the mistaken belief that Indian culture and religion, being spiritual, are indifferent towards problems of a material life. This erroneous belief is the result of deliberate propaganda and of a wrong meaning of spiritualism. As a matter of fact our definition of religion ('Dharma') has taken materialism fully into account. Dharma is defined as that which leads to both physical and metaphysical development. Materialism and spiritualism are neither contradictory nor separate from each other. Spiritualism

is a point of view of life from which we look at all problems.

If spiritualism can give a true definition of the universe there is no reason why it should not

give us a solution to all problems of the world. India has not thought only of the metaphysical world, it has thought of material wealth also. Chanakya has said that happiness depends upon Dharma and Dharma depends upon material wealth.

DYNAMIC RELIGION

THE Vedic Religion has always undergone transformation. This religion is dynamic and living. It is not like a stagnant pool. New thoughts have always entered this religion and old thoughts have developed through change, but every new change has kept up its link with the old. Every new agitator maintained a feeling of reverence for his ancestors. Every new reformer gave respect to our ancient tradition, our ancestors and achievements and at the same time propounded new thoughts to suit the times. As these new thoughts had not broken off with the basic thought, they did not in any way harm the life of the nation. On the contrary, they contributed to its development.



KUSHABHAU THAKRE

SHAT-SHAT NAMAN!

Shri Kushabhau Thakre (15 August 1922 – 28 December 2003) was born in Dhar, Madhya Pradesh to parents Dr. Sundar Rao Shripati Rao Thakre and Smt. Shanta Bai Sundar Rao Thakre. He was educated at Dhar and Gwalior. In 1942 he was inducted as a Pracharak in the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh then moved to the Ratlam Division (Ratlam, Ujjain, Mandasaur, Jhabua, Chittaur, Kota, Bundi, Jhalawad, Banswada (Raj.), Dahod (Gujarat)). Shri Kushabhau Thakre remains a guiding light to thousands of karyakartas of BJP who were inspired by him to dedicate themselves to nation

building process. In 1956, he became Secretary (Organisation) Madhya Pradesh of Bharatiya Jana Sangh. He was appointed All India Secretary of Bharatiya Jana Sangh and the party's in-charge of Orissa and also additional in charge of Gujarat in 1967. In 1974 he was made All India Secretary (Organisation). During the Emergency (1975–1977), he was jailed for 19 months along with other opposition political leaders. He was elected to Lok Sabha in 1979 in a by-election from Khandwa, Madhya Pradesh. When the Bharatiya Janata Party was formed in 1980, he was appointed as a Secretary and in



charge of Gujarat, Odisha and Madhya Pradesh. He held offices as a National General Secretary and Vice-President. He remained National President of BJP from April 1998 to August 2000. He passed away on 28 December 2003 at the age of 81. ■

BJP LEADER KIRAN MAHESHWARI IS NO MORE

BJP leader and Rajsamand MLA Smt. Kiran Maheshwari (59) lost her battle with Covid-19 and passed away at a hospital in Gurugram on November 29. Born on October 29, 1961, in Ratlam, Smt. Kiran Maheshwari entered public life at the age of 24 and went on to win a term in Lok Sabha election and three consecutive terms in assembly from Rajsamand. Smt. Maheshwari was elected to Lok Sabha from Udaipur-Rajsamand seat in 2004, when she defeated Girija Vyas of Congress. She was elected an MLA from Rajsamand for the first time in 2008 and she held the post of Higher Education Minister in the previous BJP government in the State.

She also served as the BJP National Secretary in 2011 and National Vice-President in 2013. She was earlier the BJP Mahila Morcha's National President in 2006.

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, BJP National President Shri Jagat Prakash Nadda, and several other leaders condoled Smt. Maheshwari's demise.

The Minister said that no language will be imposed on any student but enabling provisions should be made so that bright students are not deprived of Technical Education due to lack of knowledge of English language.

He further said that all the stakeholders are taking concerted efforts to ensure effective implementation of the New Education Policy-2020. ■

RS 1,04,963 CRORE OF GROSS GST REVENUE COLLECTED IN THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER 2020

The gross GST revenue collected in the month of November, 2020 is Rs. 1,04,963 crore of which CGST is Rs. 19,189 crore, SGST is Rs. 25,540 crore, IGST is Rs. 51,992 crore (including

Rs. 22,078 crore collected on import of goods) and Cess is Rs. 8,242 crore (including Rs. 809 crore collected on import of goods). The total number of GSTR-3B Returns filed for the month of November up to 30th November 2020 is 82 lakhs.

The government has settled Rs. 22,293 crore to CGST and Rs. 16,286 crore to SGST from IGST as regular settlement. The total revenue earned by Central Government and the State Governments after regular settlement in the month of November 2020 is Rs. 41,482 crore for CGST and Rs. 41,826 crore for the SGST.

In line with the recent trend of recovery in the GST revenues, the revenues for the month of November 2020 are 1.4% higher than the GST revenues in the same month last year. During the month, revenues from import of goods was 4.9% higher and the revenues from domestic transaction (including import of services) are 0.5% higher than the revenues from these sources during the same month last year. ■

US\$28.1 BILLION FDI INFLOWS INTO THE COUNTRY DURING THE JULY-SEPTEMBER QUARTER

Total Foreign Direct Investments (FDI) inflows into India during the second quarter of financial year 2020-21 (July, 2020 to September, 2020) have been US\$ 28,102 million, out of which FDI equity inflows were US\$ 23,441 million or Rs. 174,793 crore. This takes the FDI equity inflows during the financial year 2020-21 upto September 2020 to US\$30,004 million which is 15% more than the corresponding period of 2019-20. In rupee terms, the FDI Equity inflows of Rs 224,613 Crore are 23% more than the last year. August, 2020 has been the significant month when US\$ 17,487 Million FDI equity inflows were reported in the country. ■

OPPOSITION PARTIES ARE MISLEADING FARMERS & PEOPLE OVER AGRICULTURE SECTOR REFORMS ISSUE: BJP

OPPOSITION PARTIES ARE PLAYING A DUBIOUS ROLE IN THE ENTIRE ISSUE & CONSPIRING TO CREATE UNREST, SAYS RAVI SHANKAR PRASAD

Senior Bharatiya Janata Party leader and Union Minister Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad on 7 December addressed a press conference at BJP National headquarters in Delhi where he alleged that the opposition parties were misleading farmers and people over agriculture sector reforms issue. He said opposition parties were playing a dubious role in the entire issue and conspiring to create unrest by misleading people. Salient points raised by Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad in the Press Conference are as follows:



- Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi led Bharatiya Janata Party government at the Centre has always remained committed for the welfare and wellbeing of our farmers. Our government through laws related to agriculture sector reforms have been finding ways to improve lives of our farmers and to make them more progressive and give more opportunities to prosper and grow.
- To serve their petty political purposes and to save their vested interests, Congress along with other opposition parties are misleading and befooling innocent farmers just for their own political gains. They are unnecessarily and irresponsibly trying to create unrest among the farmers. This exposes the dubious and divisive character of such political parties.
- We strongly criticise those political parties who are opposing just for the sake of opposing without any logic or substance. He strongly criticised political parties who are trying to instigate innocent farmers just to meet their political goals and serve their vested interests. Nation will never forgive Congress and other opposition parties for befooling and misleading our farmers. Opposition parties are misleading our farmers but the fact is that agriculture sector reforms laws are in best interests of our farmers.
- When opposition parties are losing their relevance and are getting sidelined, when they are losing elections from panchayat to Parliament, when the

people of India are rejecting them again and again, then these failed parties are trying to create a fake narrative and trying to build a false movement. We have seen this time and again, be it at the time of pro Section 370 protests, anti CAA protests and protests at Shaheen Bagh.

- Farmers' leaders have categorically told political leaders not to share their stage or join their protests. But Congress and some other political parties are irresponsibly and unwarrantedly trying to give protests a wrong direction in order to serve their political interests.
- In 2019 Lok Sabha elections Congress had promised to repeal APMC act in English manifesto and make amendments in the APMC Act in Hindi version of manifesto. In a press conference in 2013 Rahul Gandhi had declared to take out fruits and vegetables from the ambit of the APMC Act. He had also promised to make amendments in the Essential Commodities Act.

“Farmers have unfortunately fallen in the trap of politics of some people with vested interests. We are committed to give small and marginal farmers good opportunity for their produce at markets.”

“I want to clarify once again that no land of farmers will either be sold, mortgaged or taken on lease. There will be no collateral on farmers’ land.”

- The then Union Agriculture and Consumer Affairs Minister Sharad Pawar in the UPA government, Sharad Pawar had in August 2010 and November 2011 written letters to all Chief Ministers asking them to immediately implement Model APMC Act and make amendments in the State APMC Act.
- In 2005 while giving interview to journalist Shekhar Gupta, Sharad Pawar had said if they does not reform the Mandis, they would not get financial support from the government. He even talked about penalising those opposing it. In his interview Sharad Pawar had even given timeline for abolition of the APMC Act.
- In the agriculture sector reforms matter a report was tabled in front of Parliament's Standing Committee in which Mulayam Singh Yadav is also a member. The Standing Committee Report categorically states that it is need of the hour to save our farmers from the clutches of Mandis.
- During the Congress rule, Planning Commission in 2011 in its report had said that there was an urgent need to bring major changes in th APMC system. The Planning Commission had highlighted that to achieve this there was an urgent need to give to our farmers a better village level infrastructure and make arrangements for storage and processing of their produce.

- Between 2007 and 2012 the then Manmohan Singh government made laws for model contract farming which were implemented by almost all state governments and in majority of these states the Congress was in power.
- Arvind Kejriwal government on 23 November 2020 notified the Agricultural Sector Reforms law in Delhi, but now they are opposing it.

“Till date 1,000 Mandis, 1.68 crore farmers and 1.51 lakh traders have registered with e-NAM platform. Trade worth over Rs 1.15 lakh crore has been done through the e-NAM platform.”

- Constituents of UPA government or parties which supported UPA like NCP, DMK, RJD, Samajwadi Party, Bahujan Samaj Party, Left and TMC besides other parties supported pro farmer agriculture sector reforms bill in Parliament. But now they are taking sides with the Congress and opposing the law. All these parties are equally responsible for hurting the interests of our farmers.
- Since the implementation of Agriculture sector reforms laws minimum support price (MSP) of six Kharif and Rabi crops have been hiked. By the end of November, 318 lakh tonnes of rice worth Rs 60,000 crore has been procured. Approximate 64% i.e. 202 lakh tonnes of paddy has been procured from Punjab itself.
- If we had any intention of shutting down Mandis and end MSP regime, procurement of rice at such a large scale would not have been done. ■

PM INAUGURATES CONSTRUCTION WORK OF AGRA METRO PROJECT IN AGRA

PM Shri Narendra Modi on December 7 inaugurated construction work of Agra Metro project in Agra, Uttar Pradesh today through video conference. Union Minister of Housing and Urban Affairs, Shri Hardeep Singh Puri, Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, Shri Yogi Adityanath, and other dignitaries attended the event.

The Agra Metro project comprises 2 corridors with a total length of 29.4 km and connects major tourist attractions like Taj Mahal, Agra Fort, Sikandra with railway stations and bus stands. The project will benefit the 26 lakh population of the city of Agra and will also cater to more than 60 lakh tourists who visit Agra every year. It will provide an environment-friendly Mass Rapid Transit System to the historic city of Agra. The estimated cost of the project will be Rs 8,379.62 cr which will be completed in 5 years.

Earlier, on 8th March 2019, Prime Minister inaugurated the Agra Metro project along with the commencement of commercial operations of Lucknow Metro on the entire 23 km long North-South corridor from ‘CCS Airport to Munshipulia’. ■

WHO WORLD MALARIA REPORT 2020: INDIA CONTINUES TO MAKE IMPRESSIVE GAINS IN REDUCTION OF MALARIA BURDEN

India the only high endemic country which has reported a decline of 17.6% in 2019 over 2018

INDIA HAS SUSTAINED ANNUAL PARASITIC INCIDENCE (API) OF LESS THAN ONE SINCE 2012

The World Malaria Report (WMR) 2020 on 2 December released by WHO, which gives the estimated cases for malaria across the world, based on mathematical projections, indicates that India has made considerable progress in reducing its malaria burden. India is the only high endemic country which has reported a decline of 17.6% in 2019 as compared to 2018. The Annual Parasitic Incidence (API) reduced by 27.6% in 2018 compared to 2017 and by 18.4% in 2019 as compared to 2018. India has sustained API less than one since year 2012.

India has also contributed to the largest drop in cases region-wide, from approximately 20 million to about 6 million. The percentage drop in the malaria cases was 71.8% and deaths was 73.9% between 2000 to 2019.

India achieved a reduction of 83.34% in malaria morbidity and 92% in malaria mortality between the year 2000 (20,31,790 cases, 932 deaths) and 2019 (3,38,494 cases, 77 deaths), thereby achieving Goal 6 of the Millennium Development Goals (50-75% decrease in case incidence between 2000 and 2019).

Decrease in incidence of Malaria cases is also exhibited in the year-on-year tally. The cases and fatalities have declined significantly by 21.27% and 20% in the year 2019 (3,38,494 cases, 77 deaths) as compared to 2018 (4,29,928 cases, 96 deaths). The total number of malaria cases reported in 2020, till October, (1,57,284) has further decreased by 45.02 percent as compared to corresponding period of 2019 (2,86,091).

Malaria Elimination efforts were initiated in the country in 2015 and were intensified after the launch of National Framework for Malaria Elimination (NFME) in 2016 by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. National Strategic Plan for Malaria Elimination (2017-



World Health Organization

22) was launched by the Health Ministry in July, 2017 which laid down strategies for the next five years. ■

UP GOVT. LED BY YOGI ADITYANATH BRINGS ORDINANCE AGAINST FORCIBLE RELIGIOUS CONVERSIONS

Uttar Pradesh Government has brought 'Prohibition of Unlawful Conversion of Religion Ordinance 2020'. It was passed on 24 November by the cabinet led by Yogi Adityanath and promulgated on November 28 by Uttar Pradesh Governor Smt. Anandiben Patel. The law has provisions for imprisonment up to 10 years and a maximum fine of Rs 50,000 under different categories. Several other BJP-ruled states like Haryana, Madhya Pradesh and Assam have also prepared drafts to pass similar laws. Yogi Adityanath had announced during UP by-poll campaign that his administration would bring a law that prevents forced conversion for marriage, terming it to be 'Love-Jihad'. ■

PM HOLDS ALL PARTY MEETING TO DISCUSS COVID-19 VACCINATION STRATEGY

P rime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on 4 December participated in the All Party Meeting via video con-ferencing to discuss the Covid-19 vaccination strategy in India. The meeting was also attended by the Union Defence Minister, Union Home Minister, Union Finance Minister, Union Minister for Rural De-velopment, Union Minister for Social Justice and Empowerment and Union Minister for Parliamentary Affairs. Prime Minister said that the government is developing a comprehensive vaccination strategy. He emphasised that the world is looking towards India for the development of a safe and affordable vaccine.

Prime Minister shared his experience of visiting the vaccine manufacturing facilities in Ahmedabad, Pune, and Hyderabad, informing that about eight potential vaccines, currently in different stages of trial, will be manufactured in India, that includes the three indigenous vaccines.

Prime Minister said that it is expected that the

vaccine will be available in the coming few weeks. The vaccination campaign will kickstart in India as soon as the vaccine is approved by the scientists. The Central government is working in close coordination with the State governments to identify the priority groups for vaccination that will include Health Workers, Frontline workers and high-risk individuals viz the aged population cohort and people with comorbidities. In an effort to administer the vaccine in an efficient, smooth & transparent manner, database of healthcare and frontline workers, augmentation of cold chains and procurement of syringes and needles are in advanced stages of preparation.

Underlining India's vaccine distribution expertise, capacity and presence of an experienced and vast network for vaccination, the Prime Minister said that this will help us in streamlining Covid vaccination. Collaboration with State Governments will be established for additional cold chain equipment and other such logistical requirements. ■

ADB, INDIA SIGN \$50 MILLION LOAN TO BOOST WEST BENGAL'S DIGITAL PLATFORMS FOR PUBLIC FINANCE REFORMS

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) and the Government of India on 2 Dec. signed a \$50 million policy-based loan to improve financial management procedures and operational efficiencies aimed at achieving more fiscal savings, promote informed decision making, and improve service delivery in the state of West Bengal.

The signatories to the West Bengal Public Finance Management Investment Programme were Dr. C. S. Mohapatra, Additional Secretary, Department of Economic Affairs in the Ministry of Finance who signed for the Government of India, and Mr. Takeo Konishi, Country Director of ADB's India Resident Mission who signed for ADB.

Dr. Mohapatra stated that integration of the state's financial and information systems through the programme's whole-of-government approach will help improve delivery of public services and generate fiscal

savings that could help the state augment growth-enhancing development financing.

Mr. Konishi said that through support to interoperable e-Government platforms, the programme will ensure streamlining of social protection benefits such as pension and provident fund, facilitate gender-disaggregated data, tax payments, and revenue collection.

The loan is proposed to be supplemented by a \$350,000 technical assistance grant for capacity building, monitoring of IFMS reforms, and strengthening the integration of social and gender aspects in reform areas.

Development projects could be better tracked and monitored with the help of a new module within the integrated financial management system (IFMS) leading to improved project management. A centre for fiscal policy and public finance will be

established to deepen capacity of the state government officials on public finance management while developing a web-based grievance redress system for transport corporations and urban local bodies will provide a credible citizen-government interface.

The loan builds up on past ADB policy-based programmes in 2012 and 2017, supporting the Government of West Bengal on sustainable public financial management reforms. These programmes helped develop and implement an IFMS, established successful e-Governance systems for improved revenue administration, undertook measures for expenditure rationalisation, and promoted the private sector's involvement in service delivery.

The loan is proposed to be supplemented by a \$350,000 technical assistance grant for capacity building, monitoring of IFMS reforms, and strengthening the integration of social and gender aspects in reform areas.

ADB is committed to achieving a prosperous, inclusive, resilient, and sustainable Asia and the Pacific, while sustaining its efforts to eradicate extreme poverty. Established in 1966, it is owned by 68 members—49 from the region. ■

After leaving school or college, two things never end - one, the influence of your education, and second, your bonding with your school or college. Whenever alumni interact with each other, in their memories of school or college, greater time is given to reminiscing about time on campus and moments spent with friends than about books and studies, and, from these memories, a feeling is born to do something for the institution.
- What can bring greater happiness than to lend a hand in development of the place where your personality was moulded? I have read certain such efforts, where the former students have given back to their old institutions in great measure. Nowadays, alumni are very active in this. IITians have provided their institutions many facilities like Conference Centres, Management Centres & Incubation Centres set up by their efforts. All of these endeavors improve the learning experience of the current students. IIT Delhi has initiated an endowment fund, which is a brilliant idea. There is a culture of such endowments in renowned universities across the world, which helps the students. I think that universities of India are also capable to institutionalize this culture.
- The 5th December is the death anniversary of

Sri Aurobindo. The more we read Sri Aurobindo, greater is the insight that we get. The more my young friends learn about Sri Aurobindo, greater will they learn about themselves, enriching themselves.

- Friends, likewise, Shri Aurobindo's views on education were very lucid. He did not consider education to be limited only to bookish knowledge, degree and job. 


