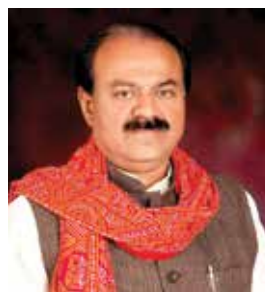

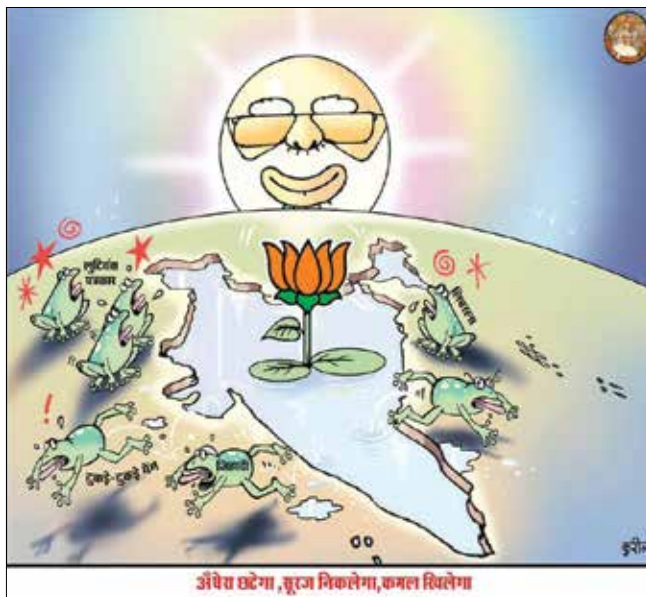

The Bharatiya Janata Party on 23 May, 2019 stunned the Opposition and the political pundits with a historic landslide victory in Lok Sabha elections 2019. The BJP had secured victory on 303 seats and the National Democratic Alliance (NDA), which includes parties like Janata Dal (United), Shiv Sena, SAD and AIADMK bagged 353 seats. On the other hand, Opposition parties are on verge of an existential crisis, especially the Congress. The grand old party scored only 52 seats which is less than the required numbers to get even the status of the main opposition party in the Lok Sabha.

Subsequent to a long and arduous election, with months of campaigning and voting spread over seven phases; India's 879 million voters have finally spoken almost in one voice and handed another historic mandate and resounding victory to Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi led Bharatiya Janata Party.

BJP's 2014 victory was already record-setting; the first time a single party had attained a parliamentary majority in three decades but 2019 results surpassed even that figure and set a new benchmark for itself. To win once

at that scale was astounding, a black swan event. To win twice means that Indian politics, and India itself, has changed beyond recognition.

Never since Indira Gandhi's famous 1971 electoral triumph had an incumbent Prime Minister returned with a majority. Never since 1984 had a party crossed the 300-

The Lok Sabha Election Results 2019 threw some big surprises. Some of the biggest names in Indian politics faced defeat at the hands of electorate. Biggest shock was Congress chief Rahul Gandhi's defeat in family bastion Amethi. Rahul Gandhi lost to Smt. Smriti Irani by a margin of over 55,000 votes. Jyotiraditya Scindia lost his royal family's bastion Guna, Madhya Pradesh. The seat had been in his family since its formation. Congress leader Malikarjun Kharge faced first ever defeat in his political career. He has consecutively won 10 elections [9 assemblies, 1 general] since 1972. Other surprises in Congress's dock included Ajay Maken, Sheila Dikshit, Digvijay Singh and Shatrughan Sinha and PDP president and former CM Mehbooba Mufti lost the Anantnag Lok Sabha seat to NC.

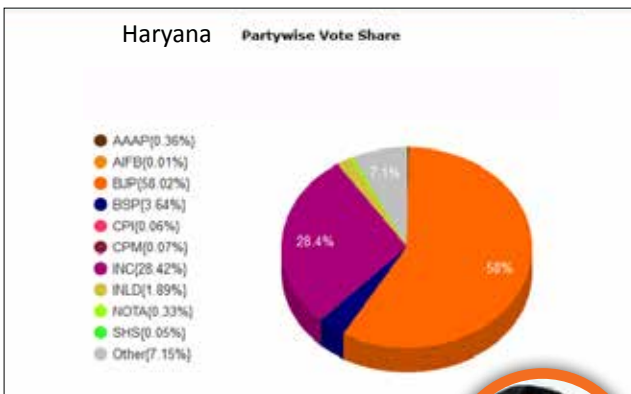
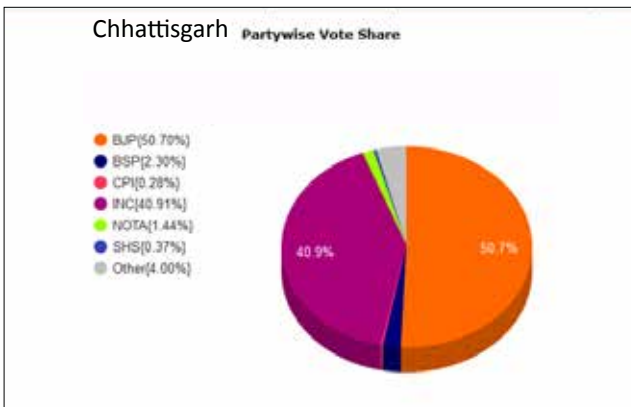
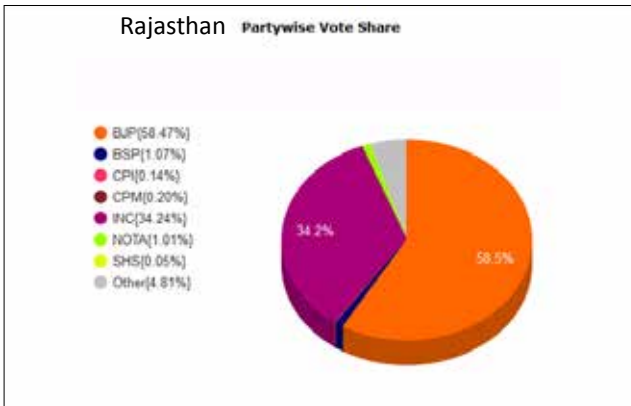


Uttar Pradesh Partywise Vote Share

seats along with its allies. The last time a party crossed the 300-seat mark was in 1984, when the Congress won more than 400 seats in the wake of Indira Gandhi's assassination.

The scale and spread of the BJP's victory are impressive. Apart from winning an unprecedented majority, the BJP vote share in 12 states is more than 50 per cent, including in big states such as Karnataka, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan. In Uttar Pradesh and Tripura, the BJP vote share is 49 per cent.

The Congress, expected to challenge the BJP at least in some of the Hindi heartland states after its Assembly poll successes in December, won a mere 52 seats. It had won 44 seats in 2014. No one from the Congress may get the status of the leader of the opposition party in the Lok Sabha for the second time in succession, because it does not have 10 per cent of the strength of the House.

The Congress could not win a single seat in as many as 14 states including Rajasthan, Gujarat and Haryana. In bigger states such as Madhya Pradesh, UP, Jharkhand, Karnataka and Maharashtra, the Congress won one seat each. To add insult to injury Smt. Smriti Irani defeated Congress President Rahul Gandhi in his stronghold of Amethi by over 55,000 votes.

In states like Uttar Pradesh, where some had expected the 'Mahagatbandhan' of the Samajwadi Party-Bahujan Samaj Party-Rashtriya Lok Dal to stop the BJP's

15 seats, with the Bahujan Samaj Party winning 10 and Samajwadi Party five.

The BJP also made inroads into states it had termed its "final frontiers", including West Bengal, Odisha and Telangana. In West Bengal, the BJP won in 18 seats against the Trinamool Congress' 22, with a vote share of 40.2 per cent. In Odisha it got 8 seats and in Telangana, the BJP won four seats. Nationally, the BJP is on its way to increasing its vote share from its all-time high of 31 per cent in 2014 to nearly 37 per cent.

After the thrashing victory, at the BJP's victory celebrations at the central office in the national capital, PM Shri Modi appealed to his workers to exhibit humility in what is the greatest electoral triumph since the independence in 1947.

In his speech at the BJP headquarters in front of supporters unfazed by the drizzle, the PM said the BJP respected India's constitution and federalism, but was deeply committed to its ideological tenets. He likened the electoral battle to that of Mahabharata, and thanked the people for their support to him, who is a simple fakir, or ascetic.

"We have to move ahead. We have to take everyone with us, even our opponents. We have to work for the benefit of the country," the PM said, adding he would not do anything with bad intent even though he might at times commit a mistake on the job.

Amid cries of 'Bharat mata ki jai', Shri Modi said the

juggernaut, it not only won 62 seats, along with two of the ally Apna Dal, but bagged a staggering vote share of 49.6 per cent.

In effect, the BJP in UP improved significantly on its 2014 vote share of 42.3 per cent. In 2014, the BJP alliance had won 73 seats, including two of the Apna Dal. The Mahagatbandhan could win or was leading in only

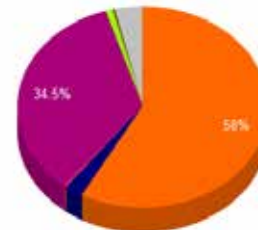

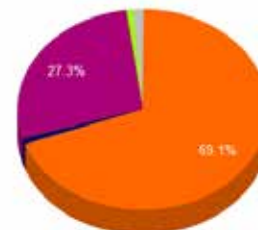

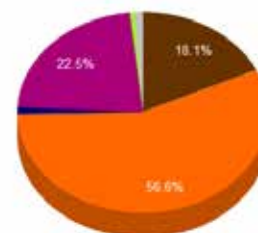

BJP's inspiration was its commitment to nationalism, but also said the electoral triumph belonged to the poor, who have benefited from his government's social welfare schemes.

Shri Narendra Modi also renewed his promise to provide housing to all by 2022. The PM said this was a rare election where inflation and corruption were not electoral planks. He said the electoral verdict of 2019 had dealt a blow to those who exploited caste for electoral benefits. "Now, there are only two castes — one of the poor, and the other of those who can help uplift those who are in poverty," he said.

At the celebrations, BJP National President Shri Amit Shah introduced PM Shri Modi as one of the most powerful leaders of the world. In his speech, while Shri Shah congratulated Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik and Andhra Pradesh's YSR Congress Party on their respective wins in the Assembly polls in the two states, he said that the BJP would soon conquer West Bengal.

Congratulatory messages poured from leaders across the world, including from USA President Donald Trump, Chinese President Xi Jinping, Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, Russian President Vladimir Putin and Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan. ■

The newly elected Member of Parliament from Secunderabad (Hyderabad) constituency Shri G. Kishan Reddy represents the energetic youth leadership of the BJP. Starting his political career as a youth leader he assumed the charge of National President of Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM) from 2002 to 2005. He was elected as an MLA from Himayatnagar constituency in 2004 and was elected again in 2009 & 2014 to Amberpet assembly constituency of Telangana. He was unanimously elected as the Telangana BJP President succeeding Shri Bandaru Dattatreya. During this period he also handled responsibilities like BJP Floor Leader in the State Assembly successfully. With his victory from Secunderabad this time, the party has not only retained the traditional stronghold but also it gave a major boost to BJP in Telangana.

In an Exclusive interview with the Associate Editor of Kamal Sandesh **Ram Prasad Tripathy**, Shri Reddy revealed the main reasons behind the massive victory of BJP in Telangana and the future strategy of the party for the next Assembly elections of the state.

He unveiled how the party plans to penetrate its organisation deep into the grassroots level in the state and how in 2023, throwing out the family and dictatorial government of TRS the BJP will come to the power in the state. Excerpts;

Sir, many Congratulations on being elected as the Member of Parliament from Secunderabad seat this time. From a win in just one Assembly seat of the 118 constituencies it contested for the Telangana Legislature in December last, to winning four Lok Sabha seats and trouncing the ruling TRS in its bastions in this election marks a spectacular performance by the BJP. What is the main reason behind this achievement?

Thank you very much for your warm wishes. I also thank the constituents of Secunderabad who elected me as Member of Parliament, party elders and the selfless Karyakartas of BJP, for whom this victory was possible.

Yeah, correctly you said from a win in just one Assembly seat in Telangana Legislature in December last year, to winning four Lok Sabha seats and trouncing the ruling TRS in its own bastions within four months is truly a spectacular performance by the BJP. And, the giant-killing defeat inflicted on Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao's daughter K. Kavita in Nizamabad by first-timer Shri D. Aravind was the icing on the cake. Apart from these two, we won two more seats i.e. Adilabad and Karimnagar in Telangana.

So far as the main reasons behind this achievement is concerned, I believe, everybody worked hard but the key reason behind this great



performance is PM Shri Narendra Modi ji himself and his remarkable performance in the last five years at the centre. Hence, from the very beginning of the 2019 election process the electorate has decided to vote Modiji and form the BJP government at the centre.

What are the key issues on which you fought the elections in Telangana?

The entire Lok Sabha election primarily revolves round the charisma of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and his government's development and welfare schemes. Shri Narendra Modi's impeccable track record, corruption free governance, his commitment towards the nation, his dedication towards his work, his vision for a 'New India' and his good governance has won over the hearts of every Indian.

Apart from it, development, National security, good governance, corruption free government, keeping the country safe from the clutches of the anti-national mindset parties etc., are some of the other major issues of this election.

The popular schemes of the Modi government like providing electricity to the last village of the country, providing LPG connection to BPL families under Ujjwala Yojana, providing sanitation under Swachhata mission, bank account for direct case transfer under Jan Dhan Yojana, providing best health care facilities to the poor under Ayushman Bharat, providing housing for all by 2022, network of roads in the nook and corner of the country, strengthening the defense sector, a robust economy which have enabled 'Ease of Living' for citizens and elevated India to assume its rightful place as a major power in the comity of nations have been some of the major talking points throughout the electioneering.

We fought the election on these positive points and all these issues dominated during the course of Lok Sabha elections and gave us the required support from all sections of society.

What is the main strategy of BJP for its future expansion in Telangana?

Our main focus will be to end the 'family and dictatorial rule' of Chief Ministers K. Chandrasekhar Rao in Telangana and to bring BJP to power in 2023 assembly elections in the state.

Even this mandate is also against the ruling dispensation and the results should serve as a lesson to TRS.

As the CM was busy touring the country to drum up support for his respective front without realising that the ground was slipping fast under his feet.

On developmental front, the K. Chandrasekhar Rao led TRS government is deliberately not implementing the schemes launched by the Modi government at the centre for the welfare of the people of Telangana. Therefore, on priority basis the BJP representatives will try our best to implement these welfare schemes in every village of the state and force the state government to execute all major development projects of the central government meant for the progress of Telangana on urgent basis

This is victory of the people and our Hon'ble PM Modiji. If I am elected as a Member of Parliament, it is only for my electorate. So, I dedicate this victory to all of my voters and the constituents of Secunderabad and assure them that I will perform to the best of my abilities. I seek their continued support and blessings.

What will be your message to the constituents of Secunderabad?

This is victory of the people and our Hon'ble PM Modiji. If I am elected as a Member of Parliament, it is only for my electorate. 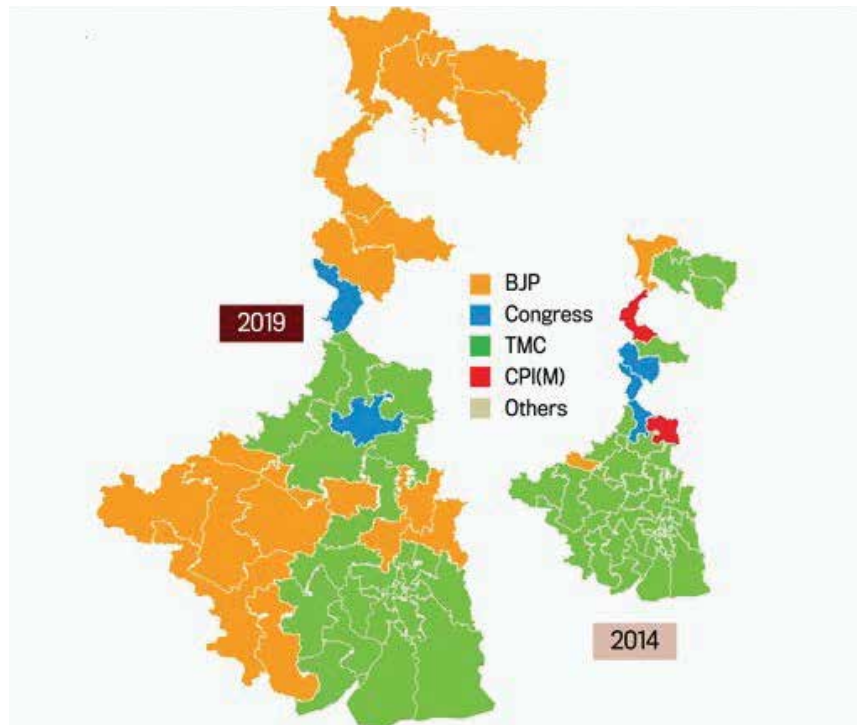
EXPANDING BJP FOOTPRINTS

WEST BENGAL

The BJP more than doubled its voter base in Bengal, from 17 per cent in 2014, to nearly 41 per cent in 2019. This helped the BJP increase its seat tally from 2 to 18. This poses a serious threat to the existence of TMC and the political ambitions of Mamata Banerjee, the two-time chief minister.

The Trinamool Congress (TMC) lost around 12 seats from last time.

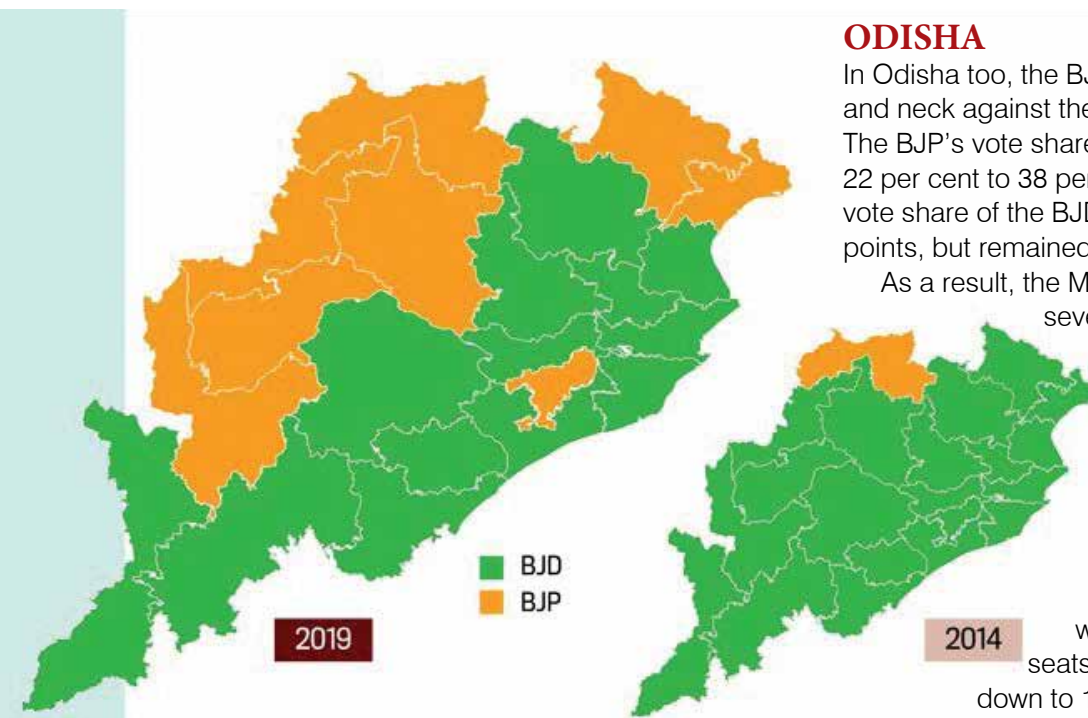
The BJP gained vote share by severely denting the support base of the Left parties. The vote share of the Communist Party of India (Marxist) (CPM) plummeted from 23 per cent in 2014, to less than 7 per cent. The BJP also ate away half of the Congress's base too.



ODISHA

In Odisha too, the BJP is now standing neck and neck against the Biju Janata Dal (BJD). The BJP's vote share in the state jumped from 22 per cent to 38 per cent. In comparison, the vote share of the BJD dropped two percentage points, but remained at about 42 per cent.

As a result, the Modi-led BJP poached seven seats from the BJD, and increased its tally to eight. The Congress, which got 26 per cent votes in the 2014 Lok Sabha elections in Odisha, reduced its influence to about 14 per cent, but won one seat. From 20 seats in 2014, BJD's tally went down to 12 this time.

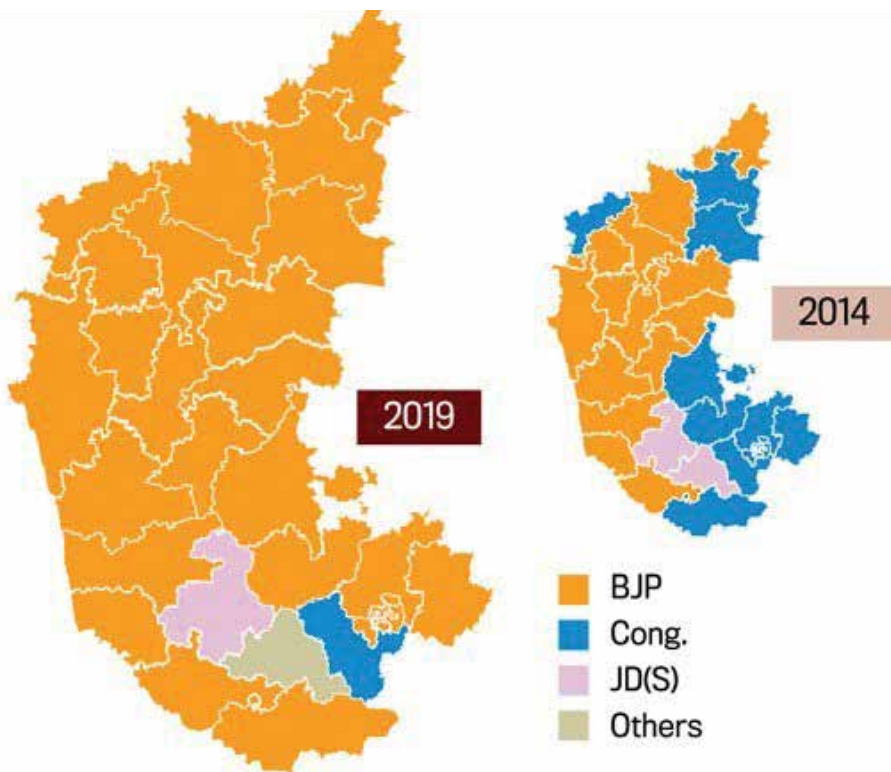

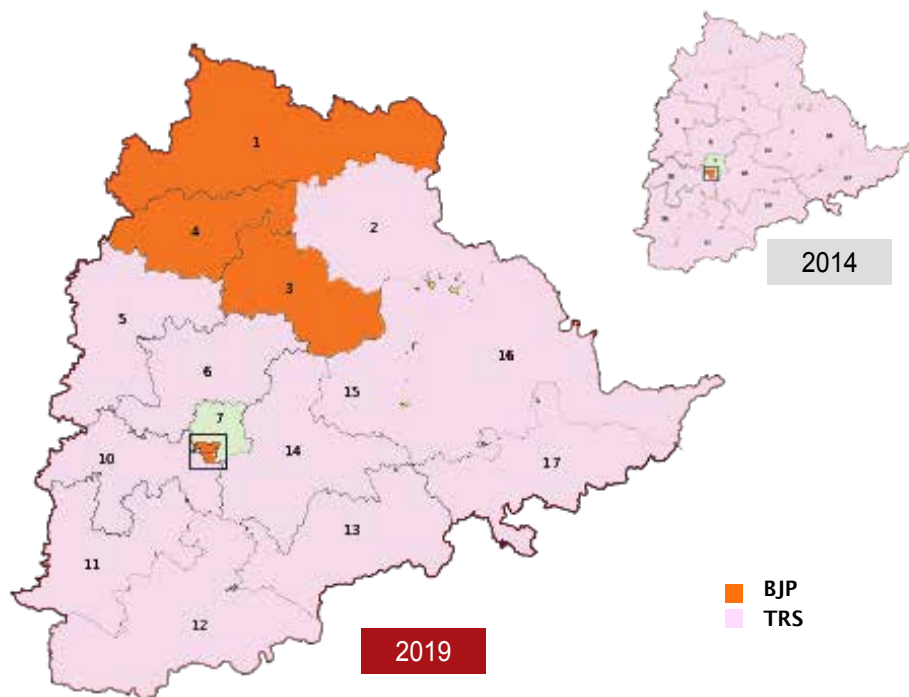
The BJP had emerged as the single largest party in Karnataka Assembly elections in 2018, with 36 per cent votes and 104 seats in the 224-seat Assembly, falling marginally short of majority. However, in 2019, it has now garnered more than 50 per cent vote share in the southern state, winning 25 of the 28 seats.

Here, the BJP severely dented the support base of the Congress, whose vote share dropped significantly from 41 per cent in 2014 general election, to 32 per cent this year. As a result, Karnataka became the playground for Congress's biggest defeat in the country. It lost eight seats, retaining just one in a state where it is in power, in coalition with the Janata Dal (Secular). The JD(S) remained a silent spectator, with a trample damage of losing one seat.



TELANGANA

The absence of Telugu Desam Party (TDP) from the contest in Telangana threw up a surprising result. All three parties BJP, Congress and the Telangana Rashtra Samithi, improved their vote share. But the BJP expended its effort in select seats, winning in four seats, respectively. The BJP nearly doubled its vote share, becoming a formidable force in the state. Though TRS won a landslide in the Assembly elections six months ago, it lost two seats in the Lok Sabha election to the BJP.

Following the resounding victory in the Lok Sabha elections, addressing the nation from the Bharatiya Janata Party national headquarters in New Delhi PM Shri Narendra Modi said the 130 crore citizens of the country stood “for India” and voted “for India.” Thousands of Party Karyakartas were present at the venue who had waited amid a steady drizzle to listen to him and were cheering, clapping, whistling and chanting “Modi, Modi, Modi”, which reverberated the thrilling atmosphere of BJP headquarters after it became evident that BJP led

NDA was on its way to an unprecedented and historic electoral triumph.

Speaking to the supporters Shri Modi appealed to party workers to show humility, take everyone along and resolved not to take any step out of ill intent.

Shri Modi said he might at times commit a mistake but he will not do anything with bad intent. He also advised workers and supporters to show restraint.

“We have to move ahead. We have to take everyone with us, even our opponents. We have to work for the benefit of the country,” he said. He urged everyone to forget the rancor of the bitter and often nasty campaign. “What’s past is past,” he said.

Shri Narendra Modi also hinted at his humble beginnings and his devotion to the people of the country. “You have filled this fakir’s bag with a lot of hope. All your hopes, dreams, ambitions are dependent on it,” he said.

He said, “I am committed to devote every moment of my time and every fiber of my being for the people of India”.

Decrying those who have used caste divisions for electoral benefits, the PM said the country will now have only two castes — the poor and those who want to alleviate poverty. He said his government’s responsibility would be to help not only the poor, but also those who want to lift people out of poverty. Voters have dealt a huge blow to the parties doing



politics in the names of castes, he said.

"People are chanting Modi, Modi. But this is not a victory of Modi, it is the victory of people who are desperate for honesty in the system," he said.

The PM said the victory was of toiling farmers who struggle to feed the nation, of those who now live in proper houses, of the middle class that follows the rules, pays taxes, but wondered if his taxes were being used for the benefit of the country. In the last five years, people have realized that the money they are contributing in taxes has been put to nation-building, he said.

"I will not do anything for myself. I will devote every moment of my time and every fiber of my being for my countrymen," the PM said.

"Whenever you judge me, judge me on these three parameters. If I fall short on these, curse me. But I assure my countrymen that what I have said in public I will do my best to fulfill," he said.

The PM said BJP led NDA government is committed to the spirit of federalism, follow the constitution and take everyone along as the country is run with consensus. Shri Modi said the 2019 election was a rare one where corruption and inflation were not planks on which the opposition fought. "This was the first one in which any political party could not level even one charge of corruption," he said.

He said the verdict has vindicated his view that it was not parties but people who fought this election. He likened the

elections with the Mahabharata. He said Krishna was asked after the war which side he supported and he answered that he stood for Hastinapur, and people have spoken in the elections that they stood for India.

The PM said this win was of people who were pining for an honest government, a victory of those who had for the last 70 years lacked even the most basic amenities, like toilets. He said his government was committed to providing housing for all by 2022.

Shri Modi reminded people that the electoral win has come at a time when the country is celebrating 150 years of Mahatma Gandhi's birth, and appealed to the people to treat the next five years as the period between 1942 and 47. ■

West Bengal, Shri Shah said. “It tells that in coming days, BJP will establish its might in West Bengal.”

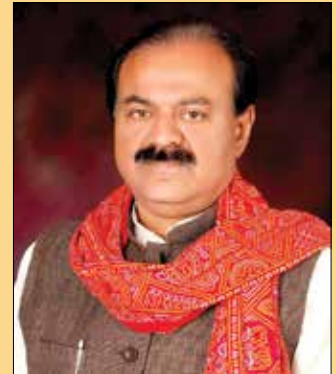

ASSEMBLY ELECTION RESULTS 2019

ARUNACHAL PRADESH

The ruling BJP government in Arunachal Pradesh, led by chief minister Shri Pema Khandu, returned to power in the state with huge margins.



In Arunachal Pradesh, BJP won 41 seats out of the 60 assembly seats, JD(U) 7 seats, the NPP got 5 and Congress managed to win 4 seats only.

ODISHA

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has come back to power in Odisha for a record fifth term as the ruling Biju Janata Dal (BJD) won 112 of the 147 assembly seats even as the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) notched up major gains in the state in the Lok Sabha battle.



Assembly elections in Odisha were held along with the Lok Sabha polls.

According to figures, Mr. Patnaik, who would join Sikkim chief minister Pawan Chamling and late West Bengal chief minister Jyoti Basu as a five-time CM, won both his Hinjili and Bijepur assembly constituencies against his nearest candidates by huge margins.

The BJP emerged as the main opposition party in the Odisha assembly with 23 seats while Congress was in just nine seats.

ANDHRA PRADESH

The Yuva Jana Sramika Rythu YSR Congress Party headed by YS Jaganmohan Reddy, recorded a landslide victory in the assembly elections in Andhra Pradesh, defeating N Chandrababu Naidu's Telugu Desam Party (TDP).



The YSRCP won around 150 out of 175 assembly seats in the state, an increase of a whopping 83 seats compared to what it secured in 2014. The TDP, which

formed the first government in the truncated Andhra Pradesh after the bifurcation of the combined state in 2014 by winning 102 seats, has ended up with just 24 seats — a sharp fall of 78 seats.

The YSRCP also swept the Lok Sabha polls in the state by establishing leads in 24 out of 25 parliamentary constituencies, leaving the remaining one to the TDP.

SIKKIM

OPPOSITION SKM ENDS CHAMLING'S 25-YEAR RULE IN SIKKIM

Opposition Sikkim Krantikari Morcha (SKM), led by its firebrand leader Prem Singh Tamang, popularly known as P S Golay, ended Chief Minister Pawan Kumar Chamling's 25-year rule in the border state after a close contest.

Of the state's 32 seats, Golay's SKM won 17 seats, leaving the Chief Minister and his Sikkim Democratic Front totally stunned, who won 15 seats.



In a solace for the 68-year-old outgoing chief minister, he won both Poklok-Kamrang and Namchi Singhithang seats, on way to a record eighth term as a legislator.

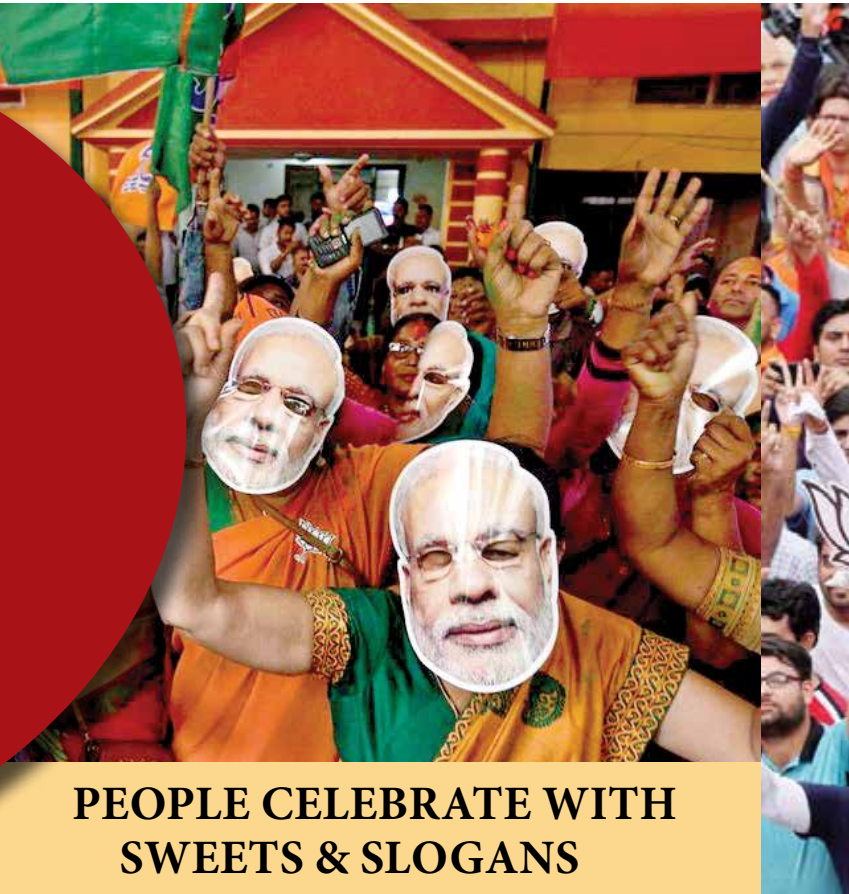
