Onam : 13th September, 2016

Onam is an ancient Hindu festival which still survives in modern times in the state of Kerala. It is the biggest festival celebrated in the state. It is also the major festival of Kerala with State holidays on 4 days starting from Onam Eve (Uthradom) to the 3rd Onam Day. The festival falls during the Malayalam month of Chingam (August - September) and marks the commemoration of home-coming of the mythical King Mahabali.

In Kerala, it is the festival celebrated with most number of cultural elements such as Vallam Kali, Pulikali, Pookkalam, Onathappan, Tug of War, Thumbio Thullal, Kummati kali, Onathallu, Onavillu, Kazhchakkula, Onapottan, Atthachamayam etc. Onam is reminiscent of Kerala's agrarian past, as it is considered to be a harvest festival. It is a community festival and celebrations are essentially connected with temples.

Kerala's rice harvest festival and the Festival of Rain Flowers, which fall on the month of Chingam, celebrates the appearance of Vamana avatar of Vishnu and the subsequent annual visit of the legendary Emperor Mahabali's from Patala Loka (the underworld). Onam is unique since Mahabali has been revered by the people of Kerala. The King is so much attached to his kingdom that it is believed that he comes annually from the nether world to see his people living happily.

It is in honour of King Mahabali that Onam is celebrated. The deity Vamana, also called Thrikkakarappan is also revered during this time by installing a clay figure next to the floral carpet (Pookalam). The birthday of Sri Padmanabhan, the presiding Deity of Thiruvananthapuram, is on the Thiruvonam day in the month of Chingam. Thiruvonam day is the most important day of Onam. In Onam 2016, Thiruvonam date is 14 September. Mahabali's rule is considered the golden era of Kerala, ancient Bharata.

The beauty of the festival lies in its inclusive fabric. People of all religions, castes and communities celebrate the festival with equal joy and verve. Onam also helps to create an atmosphere of peace and brotherhood by way of various team sports organised on the day.

The celebrations of Onam start on Atham day, 10 days before Thiruvonam. The 10 days are part of the traditional Onam celebrations and each day has its own importance in various rituals and traditions. ■





Editorial...

Those who support and sponsor terrorism must be isolated and sanctioned

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has again raised the issue of terrorism, black money and corruption in the G-20 summit held recently in China. He rightly said those who sponsor and support terrorism must be isolated and sanctioned, not rewarded. While appreciating the G-20 initiative on combating the financing of terrorism, he raised the issue on the multilateral forum drawing the attention of the entire world. Narendra Modi has been raising the issue of terrorism on almost all global forums emphasizing the threat posed by terrorism to humanity and the need to intensify efforts to counter it. In his address to US Congress and last G-20 Summit also he dwelt upon the issue of terrorism and called for strengthening counter terror measures at global level in view of the global terror network which has spread its tentacles to every corner of the world.

In the informal meeting of the BRICS leaders held one day before G-20 meeting Narendra Modi called for not to politicize terror. In the last session of the G-20 Summit he sent out a bold message calling for urgent actions against those promoting, supporting and harbouring terrorism. He clearly pointed towards Pakistan when he said that there are some nations that use terrorism as an instrument of state policy and that one country was responsible for terror activities in South Asia. "Terrorist is a terrorist, one single nation in South Asia is spreading agents of terror in our region," PM said. While highlighting the fact that India has a policy of zero-tolerance towards terrorism he said that global financing of terror network is inextricably linked to global stability and governance.

It is significant to note that Prime Minister raised the issue of terrorism in China. It is to be noted that China blocked India's bid at the UN to ban chiefs of terrorist outfits Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) and Jama'at-ud-Da'wa. India has also been stressing to China bilaterally as it urges Beijing to rethink its stance of shielding Pakistani terrorists at the UN Security Council. Prime Minister's stand on terrorism in China is considered timely intervention seeking to convince China to reconsider its stand. While positive response is awaited from China on terrorism, India could find a common ground with China on the issue of black money. Speaking on the black money Narendra Modi laid emphasis on the need "to eliminate safe havens for economic offenders, track down and unconditionally extradite money launderers and break down the web of complex international regulations and excessive banking secrecy that hide the corrupt and their deeds". He also called for "full commitment" to act against the corrupt. The proposal to establish a research centre on fugitive repatriation and asset recovery in China will go a long way in curbing corruption and black money globally.

Pakistan has become a hub of terrorism as its establishment continues to promote, support and harbor terror groups. It is not only India but other neighbouring countries are also targeted by these terror groups who are allowed to carry out their activities openly. In fact Pakistan has gained expertise only in producing and exporting terrorism and if terrorism has to be defeated this global exporter of terror needs to be stopped. Pakistan has not only become an exporter of terror but it's also engaged in serious human rights violations in Balochistan, PoK and Gilgit. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has taken a bold stand to expose Pakistan on global forums and to intensify global fight against terrorism. It's time to expose, isolate and punish Pakistan. ■

India signs defence cooperation with Vietnam

In a sharp attack on Pakistan at the G20 summit on 5 September at Hangzhou in China, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said "one single nation" in South Asia is spreading "agents of

terrorism must be isolated and sanctioned, not rewarded," Shri Modi said in his intervention during the concluding session of the meeting of the world's 20 strong economies.

"For us a terrorist is a terrorist," he asserted. Modi's remarks came a day after India called on other BRICS members to intensify joint efforts to combat terrorism.



terror" as he asserted that those who sponsor the menace must be sanctioned and isolated, not rewarded.

"Indeed one single nation in South Asia is spreading these agents of terror in countries of our region," Prime Minister Modi said in an apparent reference to Pakistan.

"We expect the international community to speak and act in unity, and to respond with urgency to fight this menace. Those who sponsor and support

The Prime Minister said India appreciates the G20's initiative on combating the financing of terrorism and asserted that all countries should meet the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) standards.

"Growing forces of violence and terror pose a fundamental challenge. There are some nations that use it as an instrument of state policy. India has a policy of zero tolerance to terrorism. Because anything less than that is not enough," Modi said.

Modi, in an apparent reference to Pakistan, had yesterday demanded "coordinated actions" by the grouping to "isolate supporters and sponsors of terror".

The Prime Minister, in his address to the Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa (BRICS) Leaders Meeting here, had said "Terrorists in South Asia, or anywhere for that matter, do not own banks or weapons factories". "Clearly, someone funds and arms them and BRICS must intensify joint efforts not just

to fight terror but to coordinate actions to isolate those who are supporters and sponsors of terror,” he had said, without naming Pakistan.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi also raised the issue of black money and tax evasion at the G20 summit in Hangzhou, urging the member countries to take action against the financial corruption.

Being the fourth Indian Prime Minister to visit Vietnam in over five decades, PM Modi was greeted with a ceremonial welcome in front of the Presidential palace in Vietnam’s capital Hanoi on Saturday morning. He was welcomed by Vietnamese president Tran Dai Quant.

The welcome ceremony began with the national anthems of India and Vietnam being played by the armed forces band. Dressed in sharp white with gold tassels and black gum boots, the prime minister later inspected a guard of honour by the three armed forces of the host country.

PM Modi paid homage to national heroes and martyrs at their monuments along with laying wreath at the war memorial located across the Ba Dinh Square. Accompanied by President Quant, PM Shri Modi also visited Vietnam’s revered leader Ho Chi Minh’s traditional stilt house near the palace. Shri Modi had earlier described him as one of 20th century’s tallest leaders in a Facebook post.

In the same post, PM Shri Modi had said: “We wish to forge a strong economic relationship with Vietnam that can mutually benefit our citizens. Strengthening the people-to-people ties will also be an my endeavour during the Vietnam visit.” ■

Health Ministry launches the biggest Leprosy Case Detection Campaign in the country

32 crore persons to be screened across 19 States/UTs

In line with the vision of Shri Narendra Modi, Hon'ble Prime Minister of India to eradicate Leprosy from India, Shri J P Nadda, Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare reviewed the National Leprosy Eradication Programme and pursuant to that, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has launched the biggest Leprosy Case Detection Campaign (LCDC) in the country on 5th September 2016 across 149 districts of 19 states/UTs. This fortnight-long campaign will cover 1656 blocks/urban areas of these districts and screen a total of 32 crore people for leprosy. For this purpose, 297604 teams comprising of one lady ASHA worker and one male volunteer each would visit every house in their allotted area and screen all the family members for leprosy.

The states and UTs covered in this campaign are Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Haryana, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Nagaland, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, West Bengal, Chandigarh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Delhi and

Lakshadweep. The districts having a prevalence rate of more than one case per 10,000 population in any of the last three years have been included in this campaign.

The Leprosy Case Detection Campaign is a

done by the search team as per the micro plan prepared for the local area to detect hidden and undetected leprosy cases. The objective of the campaign is the early detection of leprosy in affected persons so that they can be saved from physical disability and deformity by providing them timely treatment and thus also halting the transmission of disease at the community level.

The first LCDC was launched during March-April 2016 in 50 districts of 7 states namely Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha and Uttar Pradesh wherein a population of about 6.8 crores was covered. During this campaign 65427 suspected cases were identified out of which 4120 were later confirmed. ■

Modi govt. raises minimum wage of non-agricultural workers by 42 per cent

The Union Government on August 31 raised minimum wage of non-agricultural workers by 42 per cent and announced revised bonus for Central employees for two years. Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley, who chairs the inter-ministerial committee on labour, said the decisions are based on the proposals of the panel set up last year to look into the 12-point charter of demands of the trade unions. ■

Cabinet approves creation of a Project Development Fund to catalyse Indian economic presence in Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar and Vietnam

The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has given its approval to create a Project Development Fund (PDF) with a corpus of Rs 500 Crore for catalysing Indian economic presence in the Cambodia, Laos Myanmar and Vietnam.

The PDF shall be housed in Department of Commerce and operated through the EXIM Bank. The PDF shall be governed by an Inter-Ministerial Committee under the chairpersonship of the Commerce Secretary.

CLMV countries namely Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar and Vietnam have a unique position in the regional value chains and offer a gateway for market access to China/EU and other markets due to various trade agreements.

The key advantage of positioning India on the regional value chains is securing on a long term basis, a dedicated market for Indian raw materials and intermediate goods besides a dedicated source for inputs and raw materials for Indian industry. While opportunities are a plenty in CLMV region, Indian entrepreneurs' endeavors in these countries have, thus far, been limited due to limited information, infrastructure and other contingent risks.

The PDF shall benefit India's industrial community for business expansion, and to maintain cost competitive supply chains, besides integrating with global production networks. ■

Government agencies directed to ensure procurement of coming crop of pulses directly from farmers

The Government agencies - NAFED and FCI have been directed to submit state wise road map of procurement of new crop of pulses directly from farmers. They have been asked to start procurement of Moong in Karnataka immediately at MSP and bonus as new crop has started to arrive. Chairing the inter-ministerial committee meeting on prices here today, Secretary Department of Consumer Affairs, Shri Hem Pande also asked the government agencies to ensure direct payment to the farmers for procurement.

Shri Hem Pande said that procurement centres including mobile centres should be arranged near to farm gates. Wide publicity should be given to the procurement price i.e MSP plus bonus, procurement schedule and to the locations of the centres so that farmers get benefit of the initiative. ■

Benefits under Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana extended to people of all Hilly States on priority basis

Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas has decided to extend the benefits under Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana to the people of all Hilly States including North-East States by treating them as 'Priority States' and release LPG connections to the eligible beneficiaries.

This step of the Ministry will effectively address the difficulty faced by poor people residing in the States of Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Sikkim, Assam, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya and Tripura in accessing LPG for cooking purposes.

Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana is being implemented with an objective to provide deposit free LPG connections to BPL households as a clean fuel solution.

So far, more than 50 lakh connections have been released to the beneficiaries. ■

Execute Govt's social schemes : Amit Shah to CMs

Addressing the gathering BJP President Shri Amit Shah asked BJP Chief Ministers, to choose some of the 80 pro-welfare programmes, which could be implemented hundred per cent.

Delivering the inaugural address in the meet attended by Chief Ministers, Deputy Chief Ministers and State presidents, Shri Shah said the Modi Government is the first dispensation in the country which has ended the confusion that prevailed during preceding Governments whether to have an urban or a rural tilt, go for reform or stay a welfare state or promote agriculture or industry. "We have struck a balance and continued with both aspects", he said.

The BJP President said the Modi-led Government is the first one to provide Rs. 250 thousand crore to villages. Stating that his party has ushered an era of 'politics of performance', he sought Chief Ministers to make their States an effective instrument for execution of the Centre's 'pro-poor' and 'good governance' agenda.

Reminding the meeting that the party rules over 51 per cent of the country's landmass and 37 per cent population, he said States could play a key role in the success of the Modi Government's welfare policies as they are responsible for executing 65 of 80 such schemes launched by it.

Shri Shah said the Modi Government has started a new period whether in terms of the country's defence or people's welfare or enhancing the nation's prestige. If we can bring out a change in States ruled by us, then a big part of the country can experience good governance," he said.

Therefore, states could play a vital role in success of the Modi government's pro-poor policies, said Shri Shah. The Ascetic Politician

-Kushabhau Thakre

The Ascetic Politician Kushabhau Thakre Deendayalji had a style of functioning which was the same as that of the RSS. Before joining, the Jana Sangh he was a Sah-prant Prachark in eastern UP. I got the opportunity to meet Deendayalji at a Sanghashivir in Agra and the year was 1939-41. I was a student then, studying in Victoria College in Gwalior. In 1951, Kanpur was the venue of the National Convention of the Jana Sangh. Shri Mahavir was the All India Party General Secretary and Deendayalji, the incharge of the Jana Sangh in Uttar Pradesh. The RSS had deputed pracharaks to work for the BJS. I was the incharge of Madhya Pradesh. Therefore at the Kanpur meeting I got another opportunity to meet Pt. Deendayalji. It was the same meeting in which Deendayalji's name was announced for the office of the new General Secretary of the BJS. It was a historic session presided over by Dr. Syama Prasad Mookerji. Those were the days when the party was in its infancy. There were meagre facilities available with us. Deendayalji came to visit Madhya Pradesh after he became the National General Secretary. In those days we did not have any vehicle and we could not dare to ask others to provide one.

Deendayalji, accompanied by me, decided to travel by bus and we reached a place called Baghli in Madhya Pradesh. While we were



returning to Indore by a bus we met some Congressmen. They did not recognize Deendayalji but they were familiar to me. They wished me by a polite namaste. I replied but did not introduce Deendayalji to them. Later, Deendayalji asked me why I did not introduce him to them. I told Deendayalji that as he was the All India General Secretary and still traveling by a bus, the Congressmen could make fun of it. Deendayalji told me that it did not matter and it was not a question of feeling embarrassed. Wanted workers to win people's confidence Deendayalji was a simple man with high thinking. He had firm faith in reaching out to the grassroot level. He was very affectionate and caring for the party workers. He repeatedly urged the party workers to win people's confidence and trust. He was of

the view that one should fight for the welfare of the common man. Tribal people in Madhya Pradesh popularly called Deendayalji as 'Bara Sahib'. But this 'Bara Sahib' always worked for organising agitations while fighting for the tribal communities. He himself participated in several such agitations. Deendayalji's active participation sounded warning bells to the Congressmen and they launched a campaign to tarnish the good image of the BJS. They levelled false charges against the BJS workers that they were involved in felling off trees in the forests. We protested against this campaign. In the meantime Deendayalji visited Indore and came to know about the Congress propaganda. He immediately called a Press conference and said: "The government has no right to formulate any policy by marginalising the tribals." He demanded immediate announcement of a policy for the tribals. His efforts helped the BJS to penetrate into tribal areas and his words forced the Congress to do something for tribals. Pandhari Rao Kridutta was an MLA in Madhya Pradesh Assembly. He had some heated arguments with the Speaker. There was a big furore in the Assembly. Amidst all this uproar, a shoe was thrown at the chair. Kriduttaji was blamed for it and suspended. We immediately called Deendayalji and told him the whole story. A meeting

was convened. Deendayalji presided over the meeting and discussed the situation. Addressing the press later he said that one should not ignore the circumstances which precipitated such an extreme action. Never demoralised committed party men. After this incident another meeting was held at Ambala. Deendayalji had to present a detailed report as he was the general secretary. He did not mention the incident relating to Kriduttaji. The then Jana Sangh President Balraj Madhok was not pleased at this 'omission'. Deendayalji defended his decision and said that the party president should not expect him to behave like a policeman. He added, he could not discredit or demoralise any committed party worker. He always sympathised with the party cadre. Deendayalji was a man of impeccable good conduct and always used to say that any good work could succeed only if it had a firm foundation. He was unimpressed by the pomp and show in politics. In 1967, the Opposition parties outnumbered the Congress in Madhya Pradesh Assembly, as the Congress could only win 142 seats whereas the Opposition won 146 seats. But Deendayalji decided not to make any effort to form a coalition government because he was aware of the temperament of the Socialists. He never approved of horse trading in politics. He always felt that "politics is not an easy way and it follows a slippery path. Only those survive who take to this path keeping larger interests of the people." Deendayalji had a separate parameter for judging development. How far the poorest of the poor are benefitted was his yard stick.

He loved to travel and always enjoyed staying with party workers. Avoided instant reaction. His caring attitude towards party workers was reflected in his actions. He was never in a hurry to do anything and very wisely did not make instant comments. I can recall an incident when the Opposition in Madhya Pradesh had a lead of only 2 seats over the Congress. While addressing a press conference I said that we would not form government as we enjoyed only an insignificant lead. Deendayalji read this statement in some newspaper and later advised me that I should refrain from reacting instantly. Deendayalji was very impartial in his style of functioning. He never uttered a harsh word. His energy was boundless and he was a man of philosophy. He propounded a new way of life called 'Integral Humanism' which was inspired by the 'Bharatiyata' in him. There was another incident which I would like to recall. We were at Ahmedabad to participate in a BJS convention. He was displeased with some activities there and announced that he was going to leave politics. His aunt lived in Ahmedabad. We took Deendayalji to her place. There we had a discussion and tried to convince him not to leave politics. We made him withdraw his own statement, "We are in politics not for selfish reasons but to serve the nation," he said and gave a broad smile saying "I did not mean what I said earlier." ■

On the other side the party's chief spokesperson Randeep Singh Surjewala supporting PM on Balochistan stated that India should raise the issue of Pakistan army committed human rights violations in Balochistan and PoK on bilateral and multilateral forum. The contradictory stand in the Congress manifests that the main opposition party is divided into two fold on India's policy towards Balochistan & Pok.

He adds "The truth is increasing number of disappeared Baloch political and human rights activists is a reflection of Baloch resistance against colonialism and occupation. Only and only

for this reason, Pakistan has carried out five major military operations in Balochistan since 1948. In each of these catastrophic operations thousands of Baloch people including women and children have been killed and hundreds of thousands more were forced to flee their native towns and villages. Among these victims are those many thousands who disappeared without any trace. The inhumane act of disappearances, target killing and kill and dump of Baloch activists by state functionaries continues."

The Pakistani establishment's atrocities are not only being committed against Baloch people, but are also rampant in Balochistan against the Hindus, the Christians, the Hazaras and the Pashtuns. Balochistan was ruled by Hindu king before the invasion by Arab in 712AD.

Columnist Muhammad Akbar Notezai of the *Daily Times* writes in his column "The Balochistan Hindus' dilemma" that under the Yar Muhammad Khan (the chief ruler of Kalat State) Hindus were getting their due respect and economic & religious freedom. That is why Hindu did not leave Balochistan during partition. The columnist expressed shock on dangerously living condition of Hindus in Balochistan. Even they can't perform their religious practices. IANS reported referring to a Pakistan's

Private Channel, Nearly 35 Hindus were killed when dictatorial rule of General Pervez Musharraf launched operation against Nawab Akbar Khan Bugti, a former governor of Balochistan & head of Bugti tribe. The report disclosing the reason says Bugti used to keep the Hindus in proximity to his legendary fort in Dera Bugti to safeguard them from criminal elements. That is why many children, women were killed.

Increasing atrocities by Pakistani army on Baloch and rising involvement of China with the help of Pakistan government for exploiting rich natural resources and strategic location of Balochistan, have forced Baloch to look towards India with hopeful eyes. Earlier, the Baloch were being labeled by Pakistan's army as agents of Afghanistan and Iran. Now, Pak army harasses Baloch by labeling them as Hindu (Indian) agents. A report in Caravan (July, 2014) by Mahvish Ahmad, a Pakistani writer, explains the story of atrocities being committed on Baloch people. On the suspicion of a Hindu agent hiding in a remote village of Balochistan named 'Mai' Pak army shelled the mud houses of the village. Mahvish reported "It was as if the earth was on fire, and the sky was raining bullets."

Unlike Modi's 'Neighbor first' policy Nehruvian foreign policy always preferred neighbor last. He never took

China, under the guise of China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) project, started intrusion in Balochistan. Under CPEC, Pakistan surrendered approximately 2,000 acres of land in Balochistan to the Chinese government for the development of Gwadar port. The port was officially leased to China for 43 years, until 2059.

The objective of this port and corridor is to exploit rich natural resources and with the help of China, to crush brutally the aspiration of Baloch people. For China, apart from exploitation of

natural resources, gas, it is also strategic location to counter the Indian influence in Indian Ocean, Arabian Sea and Central Asia.

In initial period of its tenure Modi government under the 'Neighbor first policy' tried its best to bring solution in friendly manner and gave the message to the world that India wanted to resolve its issue with hostile neighbor Pakistan amicably. But Pakistan is unable to renounce its old habit. Now, it is right time to take tougher approach towards Pakistan. The Indian leadership must raise the Pakistan's atrocities on every international forum. ■

The main objective of the company is to identify port-led development projects under the Sagarmala Programme and provide equity support for the project Special Purpose Vehicles (SPVs) set up by the Ports / State / Central Ministries and funding window and / or implement only those residual projects which cannot be funded by any other means / mode. The Cabinet in July had approved the formation of the SDC under the administrative control of the Ministry of Shipping. The company would help in structuring activities, bidding out projects for private sector participation, identifying suitable risk management measures for strategic projects across multiple states / regions and obtaining requisite approvals and clearances.

The implementation of the identified projects would be taken up by the relevant ports, state governments/Maritime Boards, central ministries, through private or PPP mode. The Company would act as the nodal agency for coordination and monitoring of all the currently identified projects under Sagarmala as well as other projects emerging from the master plans or other sources. ■

to these schemes. The arrogance that this was the work of your Government and this is my Govt; hence we would not do this work; is not in the fitness of the things in a democracy.

This is why, with all humility, we have given similar importance to the schemes of the previous governments. This is the hallmark of our work culture as our nation is a continuous and a ceaseless system and we wish to retain that system. This is why, I have a project called PRAGATI. Under this project, every month, I myself sit and review all the on going projects. You would be amazed to know that almost 119 projects worth Rs. seven and a half lakh crores started by various previous Govts. were lying pending. I got all of them going.

Regardless of party's identity, the Country's identity holds primacy. For, If the Country moves on, it will yield dividends for the coming generations, for centuries, and exactly, for this reason, We have accorded primacy to the country's identity and not to our party. Now a days, You must have observed the scope of our work in Railways. While we are talking about having Bio-toilets in train, we also cherish the dream of Bullet train. While We talk about “Soil Health Card” for farmers, we also want to march ahead in the direction of satellite and space technology. While

We are stressing on integrated development than on isolated development.

Leaving aside entitlement, we are focused and emphatic on Empowerment because an empowering country, my brothers and Sisters, provides an identity to the Government through the prism of the newly declared schemes. But sometimes the old schemes just tumble down. Nevertheless, the Govts. is a continuity. If the earlier Govts. have done some work; then it is in the national interest that the next Government rectifies their shortcomings and gives a go ahead

I said, so much of money have been spent on them, so, all these projects should be completed. Now they are all on the way to completion. We created a project monitoring group. I asked them to look into all such projects and find out as to when were they started. I came to know that some of them were started 20 years ago, the other were started somewhere between twenty five to thirty to fifteen years earlier. The people living in the areas of these projects know all. We identified such two hundred and seventy projects worth Rs. 10 Lakhs crores which were inaugurated by some earlier govts.

and some crores of rupees were spent on all of them; but all that money was going down the drain. We started all such stuck up projects once again. Brothers and Sisters, such holding up and delaying of the schemes after having spent crores of rupees on them is a criminal negligence and we have tried to tide over such things.

Brothers and Sisters, earlier railway projects took at least two years in getting sanctions. A train is passing from somewhere, road have also been made on the both side; a rail over bridge is to be constructed. But the approval took two years. We have speeded up the approval process and have been able to shorten the approval time to three or four months, or maximum to six months.

Brothers and Sisters, however fast we may work, whatsoever may be the number of the schemes started by us; the touchstone of good administration of any Government lies in the last man delivery or the benefits accrued to that person. So, this has to be taken care off. Brothers and Sisters, when policies are clear, intentions are clear; then the sentiments behind the decisions are also a class apart and the decisions can be taken unhesitantly. So, due to the correct policies and the correct intentions our Government is taking unhesitant decisions and giving emphasis on the last man delivery.

We have seen and if you also go through the newspapers of Uttar Pradesh, every year there were stories about the outstanding balance of Sugar Cane farmers. Every year, there was news that this is not being done by the sugar mill owners, that was not being done by the state Govt, that sugar cane farmers are in distress.

Thousands of crores of the rupees was outstanding. So, we made schemes in this regard and tired to ensure the last man delivery and also ensured that the amount should reach to the farmers. Brothers and Sisters, out of the total old outstanding balance of the thousands of crores of rupees, I would like to inform you with a lot of satisfaction that almost 99.5% has been settled. It has happened for the first time after many years.

I can point out in solace that all the sugarcane which was procured and which came for marketing this time for that almost 95 per cent of farmers have got the price of sugarcane produced and I am sure and I believe that the remaining 5 percent of farmers will also be paid in the coming days.

Brothers & Sisters, We have initiated a mission to

provide LPG Connections to the poor families. We have launched a dynamic mission under “Ujawala” scheme to get rid of smokes emanating from chulha for my poor mothers. A target has been laid down to provide gas connections to 5 crores poor families within 3 years. Efforts are in progress and we have already provided gas connections to around 50 lakhs and that also have been done merely within the last hundred days - you can imagine - that it may be possible to achieve the said target even before three years. We intend to emphasis upon Last Mile Delivery in this mission.

Post has steadily become irrelevant due to onlining of our Post Offices, Information Technology, Whatsapp, messages, e-mail. Our country is known as the chains of Post Offices and we have revamped these post offices. Post Offices are linked with poor and marginalised people. Postman is the only representative of the Government who is linked with the feelings and affections of the common man. We have never safeguarded the interests of the Post Man who has always got the affections of everyone and the postman always cares for common people. We have taken measures to convert our post office into a Payment Bank. By setting of these Payment Banks, a network of Banks will be set up across the villages in the country. People will get the benefits of Jan-Dhan account. The funds of MGNREGA for the common man is now being transferred into their respective accounts through ‘AADHAAR’, the cases of corruption are decreasing. Everyone will be benefitted through the mission of converting the Post Office into a Payment Bank.

Brothers & Sisters, PSUs in our country are merely set up for loss-making units or for turning into sick units slowly and steadily or for disinvestment. This has been the common practice in the past. We have strived to launch a new work-culture. Today, I can point out in satisfaction that we have succeeded to turn the operation of so called notorious Air India into an operational profit-making undertaking during the last year. It is a fact that which all the Telcom companies of the world are profit-making units, the BSNL was turning into a heavy loss-making undertaking. We have succeeded in bringing BSNL to operational profit for the first time. Nobody believed that the Shipping Corporation of India could also rake in profit, now it is bringing profit. There was a time when it was apprehended that how would a power factory last for a week. Whether we would be able to get coal for them or not. It also used to be reported that power factories

have been shut down for want of coal. Now, we have sufficient stock of coal at the threshold of the power factories. It could be used for months by them. Dear Brothers & Sisters, we have achieved it.

Often, you must have seen that there is huge talk of corruption in our country. I have observed it myself that how corruption has looked the poor people from the lowest strata of the society and how huge amount of money is being wasted. We have linked AADHAAR Card and AADHAAR Number with the Government Policies. Dear Brothers & Sisters, earlier there was a system under which funds used to be released from public exchequer for widow pension, scholarship, persons with disabilities and minorities and also we used to receive list of beneficiaries. We looked into it deeply and found that even unborn children are also listed in it and getting benefit out of such schemes. These middlemen used to siphon off billions of rupees from it and nobody even took notice of it. But under the AADHAAR System, we have removed all these middlemen from the list of beneficiaries and directly transferred the amount to the beneficiaries and found that these are millions of such ghost beneficiaries who do not exist at all and used to receive billions of rupees from it. Now that has been checked. We saved lot of amount. We decided to find out the needy persons who were excluded from that list so that the amount of money saved from it should invariably be deposited into the accounts of those persons who want to fight for their rights. We have worked in that direction to deliver it to the last man delivery and we have made it to reach it to them.

All of us are aware of the Coal Scam. Today there is no accusation on the coal auction. No stigma is attached to it. The states which excavate coal in India, will continuously earn millions of rupees in the near future. There was a time when the auction of spectrum was surrounded by allegations. We auctioned it online and that has filled the coffers of the country, bringing about healthy competition and also fetching benefits for the nation.

Dear Brothers and Sisters, today the world is passing through an era of global economy. Every country today is inter-connected and inter-dependent. Economically, the whole world is somehow inter-connected in one way or other. However much we may progress in our country, we'll have to keep the global economy, global arena in view; come up to the global standards, match it also to stay relevant, and contribute, and also lead the global economy when the time comes.

Therefore, we'll have to be alert all the time. We'll have to comply with the global standards to make ourselves up to date. Recently, you must have seen how the World Bank, I.M.F., World Economic Forum, credit rating agencies and such other agencies in the world have all appreciated the progress of India. The world is constantly watching these things due to the decisions taken one after another by India in respect of legal reforms, improvement in system and changes in approach. We have very speedily improved our ranking in 'ease of doing business' ratings. In terms of foreign investment, with regard to foreign direct investment our country happens to be the most favourite destination in the world today. We have left behind even the big economies of the world in matters of growth rate and GDP.

Dear brothers and Sisters, do you know what an U.N. institute has estimated about India for the next two years ? They have estimated that in two years India will come up to the third spot in the economic sphere in place of its present level at number ten. Brothers and Sisters, logistic support, infrastructure, all these things are taken into account in global standards, comparisons are made with rich countries of the world. Brothers and Sisters, while making analysis regarding this logistic support and infrastructure of India, the World Economic Forum has said that India has reached above 19 ranks as compared to earlier positions and India is moving up and marching ahead rapidly. Brothers and Sisters, the way we are marching ahead with a dynamic and predictable economy in our country and also in global reference- the recently passed GST law, is also an empowering step towards it and all those parties deserve appreciations for this.

Brothers and Sisters, I had talked about a campaign from the same place- "Beti Bachao-Beti Padhao". We do not do any work in piecemeal. We have an integrated approach and I still need the cooperation of the society in the initiatives which we have taken in "Beti Bachao-Beti Padhao".

Every single parent need to be aware. We should honour the daughters, protect them and give them the benefit of government's schemes. We have covered millions of families under "Sukanya Samridhi Yojna" which guarantees benefits for the daughters when she grows up. We have given greatest importance to the insurance schemes in which women are benefitted. They are going to reap its benefits. We have "Indradhanush Tikakaran Yojna"- because if we ensure two things for our mothers and sisters i.e. economic

empowerment and empowerment against health problems and we educate them, you can take it as an assurance that if even a single woman is educated in the family, if she is strong physically and independent economically, she has power to pull the poorest of the poor family out of poverty and therefore we are working with emphasis on empowerment of women, health of women, economic prosperity of women, physical empowerment of women in our fight against poverty.

Therefore, my brothers and sisters, “Mudra Yojna”- I am happy that more than three and half crore families reaped the benefits of MudraYojna. In it, most of the people who reached to the door of banks were first timers. Even out of these almost 80 percent people were from SC/ST/OBC. Out of these too, 80 percent are women who took loans from banks, Mudra bank. This is to be considered that how will these womenfolk will contribute in economic development. Brothers and Sisters! last week we decided that our mothers and Sisters who have become the participants in the growth story, need leave after child birth. Earlier that leave was shorter but now we have increased this to 26 weeks, enabling the new mother to take care of her infant. Our weavers and the people working in textile, who make yarn and yarn rolls, used to get Rs.100. We have increased that to Rs.190 so as to strengthen the hands of my yarn producing mothers and Sisters. Our mothers, Sisters and weavers who are engaged in silk production will now receive Rs.50 more per meter of production. This has also been decided that this Rs.50 per meter will not go either to the trader or to the middleman or to the dealer. Instead this Rs.50 per meter will go via Aadhaar directly to the account of the weaver who has produced it. This will empower the weavers. We have started schemes with this intention and effect is now visible.

My dear countrymen! When we visualize railway and post office then we are able to see the unity of India. More we increase the institutions connecting India, our setup will change and that will enforce the unity of the country. So in the same tune we have started a new market scheme for farmers with the name ‘E-NAM’. Today farmers can sell their produce online in any of the markets of the country. Now he is not constrained to compulsively sell his produce in the market which is 10 Kilometers from his field. Neither to sell at low prices which is not remunerative for his hard work. Now a uniform sort of market network is establishing throughout the country with ‘E-NAM’. GST is soon to result in uniform taxation system and

a unitary arrangement thus achieved will unite India as well. You will be amazed to know that earlier a zone was to have surplus energy and there were no takers. Another zone used to be in dire need of electricity, had to remain in dark and factories used to be shut. To effect a change in this scenario, we earned a great success with the ‘One nation, One grid, One price’. Earlier it used to be Rs.10 per unit in summers but I went to Telangana few days back to find it to be one rupee ten paise per unit instead of that age old Rs. 10. This is the result of one-price system, which can connect the whole country.

A worker of our county has to change his place of work after every one or two years. But, his amount, deducted under EPF, is not transferred. You will be surprised to know that when I took the charge of the Government, Rs. 27,000 crore were lying under EPF, which belonged to the workers. Workers were not able to claim their amount, as they were ignorant of the relevant process. To solve this problem, we have issued a universal account number to each worker, which would enable easy transfer of fund to his new place of work. Now, the worker would get his amount after retirement and it would no more be lying dormant in a government treasury.

We have strengthened various initiatives such as Bharat-Mala, Setu-Bharatam, and Bharat-Net etc. We are working towards connecting the whole country and towards economic development of the country through all these initiatives.

Brothers and Sisters, this year is important due to various reasons. The country is celebrating 1000th birth anniversary of Saint Sri Ramanuja Acharyaji. The country is celebrating 150th birth anniversary of Shrimad Rajchandra Ji, the Guru of Mahatma Gandhi. The country is celebrating 350th birth anniversary of Guru Gobind Singh ji. The country is also celebrating centenary birth celebrations of Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyaya ji. While remembering Sri Ramanuja Acharya ji today, I wish to underline his message to the country. He used to say that we should serve all the devotees of the Lord, irrespective of their caste and class. He had said that we should never humiliate anyone and should give respect to all, without any discrimination on the basis of age and caste. The issue that was given importance by Gandhi, Ambedkar, Ramanujacharya, Lord Buddha, our scriptures and by our all spiritual gurus too is the issue of ‘our social unity’.
