OFF A SOFT LANDING ON MOON

India on 22 July, 2019 successfully launched its second moon mission Chandrayaan-2 from its most powerful rocket with a plan to land the rover on 07 September in the unexplored lunar South Pole, exactly a week after the liftoff was aborted due to a technical snag.

Carrying a “billion dreams” in a giant leap for the country’s ambitious low-cost space programme, the most complex and prestigious mission ever undertaken by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), will also make India the fourth country after Russia, the US and China to pull off a soft landing on the moon.

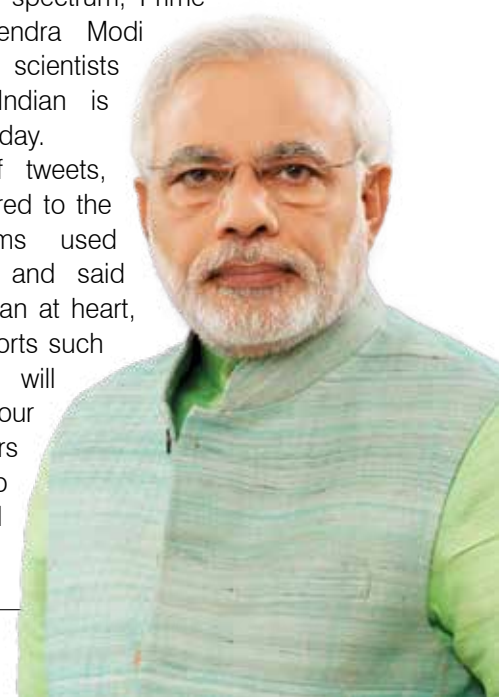
“We bounced back with flying colors after the earlier technical snag. Success is coming after a call-off,” said a beaming and visibly relieved ISRO Chairman K Sivan at the mission control room of the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota, about 100 km from Chennai, as scientists broke into cheers, shook hands and exchanged greetings.

ISRO Chairman, who announced the success of the mission, was addressing the scientists shortly after the towering geosynchronous satellite launch vehicle GSLV-MkIII-M1, dubbed as ‘Baahubali’, lifted-off from the second launch pad at the spaceport into cloudy skies at 2.43 pm and successfully placed the 3,850-kg Chandrayaan-2 into the earth orbit about 16 minutes later.

MISSION IS “INDIAN AT HEART, INDIAN IN SPIRIT”

Joined by President Shri Ram Nath Kovind and leaders across the political spectrum, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi congratulated the scientists and said every Indian is immensely proud today.

In a series of tweets, PM Shri Modi referred to the indigenous systems used in Chandrayaan-2 and said the mission is “Indian at heart, Indian in spirit! “Efforts such as Chandrayaan-2 will further encourage our bright youngsters towards science, top quality research and innovation.”



The Prime Minister also shared pictures of him watching the launch on a large screen and shared his audio message to the ISRO.

“Chandrayaan-2 is unique because it will explore and perform studies on the South Pole region of lunar terrain which is not explored and sampled by any past mission. This mission will offer new knowledge about the moon,” Shri Modi said.

ABOUT THE MISSION

The ISRO is aiming for a soft landing of the lander in the South Pole region of the moon where no country has gone so far.

Immediately after Chandrayaan-2's separation from the rocket, the solar array of the spacecraft automatically got deployed and the ISRO Telemetry, Tracking and Command Network at Bengaluru successfully took control of the spacecraft, the ISRO said in a statement.

According to the statement, Chandrayaan-2, a three-module spacecraft comprising orbiter, lander and rover, will be subjected to a series of orbit manoeuvres using its onboard propulsion system to take it to the vicinity of Moon over the next few weeks with the rover soft landing planned on September 7.

The mission was called off on July 15 barely an hour before the planned post-midnight lift-off after scientists noticed a glitch in the three-stage rocket during the propellant filling phase in the indigenous cryogenic engine, a decision that was welcomed as a prudent step by the Indian space fraternity.

ISRO Chairman said immediately after the technical snag was observed in an “intelligent way” one week back, the entire team swung into action. “The work done in the next 24 hours to bring the vehicle back to normal was mind-boggling.”

Scientists led by ISRO Chairman Sivan watched the launch sequence in rapt attention and broke into applause after every key stage of the rocket's flight which progressed precisely as programmed. “It is the



HOW FOREIGN MEDIA REACTED TO CHANDRAYAAN 2 LAUNCH

Almost all top media houses across the world covered the giant leap of India's space programme of launching a second Moon mission, the Chandrayaan 2, on 22 July, 2019. And almost every media house headlined the news on how ISRO managed the launch on its second attempt.

THE NEW YORK TIMES (NYT), wrote, “India Launches Chandrayaan-2 Moon Mission on Second Try”.

The article authored by Jeffrey Gettleman and Hari Kumar speaks about how nothing unites a nation better than a space programme. The NYT wrote, “This

would be a huge leap forward for India's ambitious space program, and scientists and defense experts everywhere are watching to see whether the country can pull it off.”

It added, “So are countless Indians. There are few things as unifying for a nation as a successful space program, and, over the past few weeks, Chandrayaan-2 posters have popped up everywhere and schoolchildren have been hunched over mini-Chandrayaans made from empty plastic bottles, learning the physics of rocketry.”

THE WASHINGTON POST said, “We have liftoff!”

beginning of a historical journey of India towards the moon," Sivan said.

There will be 15 "very crucial manoeuvres" in the next one and half months before the satellite is brought around the moon, he said.

"After that the D-Day will come and on that day we are going to experience 15 minutes of terror, to ensure the landing is safe near the South Pole," he added.

According to the ISRO, the lunar South Pole is an

interesting surface area which remains in shadow than North Pole.

There is a possibility of the presence of water in permanently shadowed areas around it, the agency said, adding craters in the South Pole region have cold traps and contain fossil record of the early solar system.

Anxiety gave way to unbridled joy for thousands of space enthusiasts gathered here after the successful launch. The 7,500 seat gallery set up by the ISRO to witness the rocket launch, a few kilometers away from the second launch pad, was full with those registering last week for the July 15 launch, rebooking their seats.

Chandrayaan-2 comes 11 years after ISRO's successful first lunar mission Chandrayaan-1 which scripted history by making more than 3,400 orbits around the Moon and was operational for 312 days till August 29, 2009.

The 43.43-metre tall three-stage rocket GSLV-MkIII-M1 dubbed as Baahubali for its ability to carry heavy payloads, successfully placed the Chandrayaan-2 in the Earth orbit, ISRO said.

From here onwards, the mission will undergo a series of manoeuvres by scientists to carry out different phases of the mission over the next 48 days. Subsequent to the rescheduling of the launch, the space agency has tweaked the orbital phases, increasing Earth-bound phase to 23 days as against 17 days planned originally.

At the end of the Earth-bound phase, the orbit of the spacecraft will be finally raised to over 1.05 lakh km before nudging it into the Lunar Transfer Trajectory taking

The second Moon mission will land a rover on the lunar surface in a first for the country. It is also the first time a country is attempting to explore the uncharted South Pole of the Moon. India will be only the fourth nation after the US, China and Russia to land on the Moon.

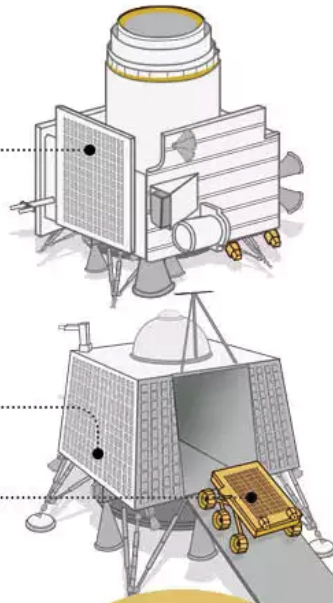

it to the proximity of Moon in the next two days.

Then gradually over the next few days it will be brought to 100 X 100 km circular orbit when the lander 'Vikram' carrying rover 'Pragyan' will separate and after another few days of orbiting it will make a soft landing at a chosen place on the Lunar surface.

"Chandrayaan-2 is the next leap in technology as we attempt to soft land close to South Pole of Moon. The soft landing is extremely complex...", Sivan had said.

The mission, which carries a total of 13 payloads, including three from the Europe, two from the US and one Bulgaria, seeks to improve understanding of the moon which could lead to discoveries that will benefit India and humanity as a whole.

A Laser Retro reflector Array (LRA) of US space agency NASA is among the payloads and is aimed at understanding dynamics of Earth's moon system and deriving clues on Lunar interior.

The lander Vikram, named after father of Indian space research programme Dr Vikram A Sarabhai, carrying the rover Pragyan, will be landed in a high plain between two craters at a latitude of about 70 degrees South of the moon. Then the 27-kg Pragyan meaning wisdom in Sanskrit and a six-wheeled robotic vehicle, will set out on its job of collecting information on lunar surface.


A safe site free of hazards for landing would be decided based on pictures sent back by the camera onboard the lander and after touchdown the rover will carry out experiments for 14 Earth days, equaling one Lunar Day. ■

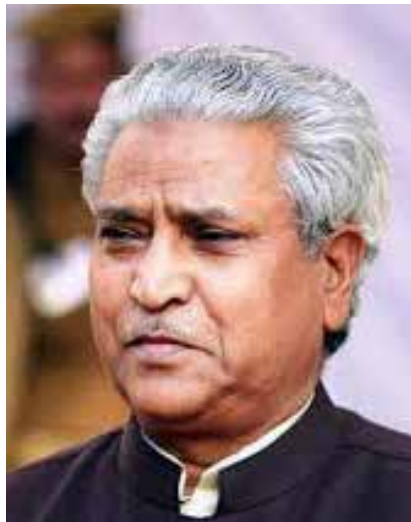
Ramlal for his decade-long service to the party. He tweeted:

CRACKDOWN ON CORRUPTION: Over 1,000 MHA officials sacked in last 5 years

More than 1,000 employees working in the Ministry of Home Affairs have been dismissed from service in the last five years on the grounds of lack of integrity and ineffectiveness in public interest, Union Minister of State for Home Shri Nityanand Rai said in the Rajya Sabha on 17 July, 2019.

Shri Rai said action against government servants is a continuous process and as per the applicable



disciplinary rules, the government has the right to take disciplinary action against erring officials by imposing prescribed penalties, including dismissal and removal from the service.

“A total number of 1,083 officials have been dismissed from government service under the applicable disciplinary rules in the ministry, including its organisations, during the last

five years,” he said, replying to a written question. ■

INTERNATIONAL ENERGY AGENCY PRAISES PRADHAN MANTRI UJJWALA YOJANA

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi’s signature Ujjwala scheme for providing free cooking gas connection to poor got appreciation from the International Energy Agency (IEA), which said it is a “major achievement” in improving the environment and health of women.

“Providing access to LPG across India by 2020 is a major achievement. It is not an energy issue, it is an economic issue, it is a social issue,” IEA Executive Director Fatih Birol said at a conference here.

Launched by PM Shri Modi on May 1, 2016, in Ballia, Uttar Pradesh, Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) aims to safeguard the health of women and children by providing free cooking gas (LPG) connection to poor families.

So far, about 7.4 crore such connections have been given. The target is to give 8 crore connections by 2020.

Use of forest wood and agriculture waste for cooking in rural households is a major source of respiratory diseases, affecting women and children, he said adding LPG is helping to provide a clean environment.

“Ujjwala is not just an energy achievement but also



social and economic achievement,” he said.

Since the BJP government came to power in 2014, the number of LPG connections in the country has doubled to more than 26 crore, covering about 90 per cent of the population. The target is to provide LPG connection, which is clean, convenient and energy-efficient source for cooking, to all households by 2020-21.

Last year, the World Health Organisation (WHO) had also hailed the scheme. ■

PM MODI IS 2019'S MOST ADMIRED MAN IN INDIA

P rime Minister Shri Narendra Modi is the most admired man in India and sixth most admired in the world, according to a survey conducted by UK-based market research firm. PM Modi moved up to sixth in the list from eight last year and is the only Indian politician to feature in the list by YouGov. Boxer Mary Kom was voted the most admired woman in India. The Prime Minister's "admiration score" stood at 4.8 per cent worldwide and was applauded for his performance soon after the results of the survey were published. ■



Pension Scheme for Unorganized Sector Workers Enrolls 31 Lakh In Last 5 Months

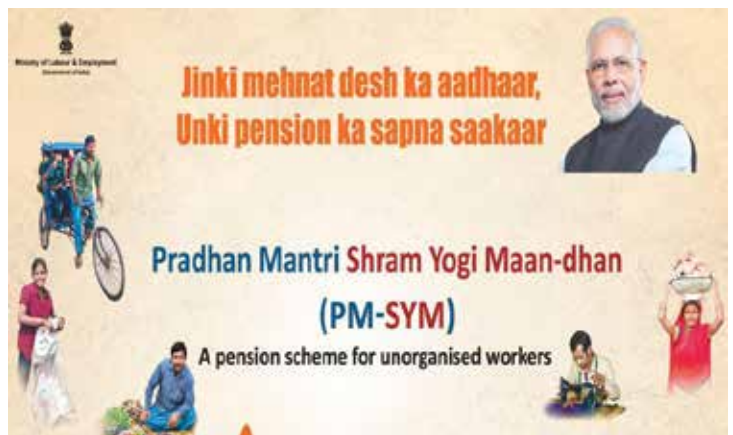
C lose to 31 lakh people have enrolled into Modi government's pension scheme for unorganised sector workers Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Maandhan (PM-SYM) in less than five months from its launch.

Launched on 15 February, the scheme was part of the interim budget. The scheme, which is voluntary, had 30.85 lakh enrollments till 10 July. The scheme is implemented through the Life Insurance Corporation (LIC).

The scheme had been launched keeping in mind the large pool of unorganised sector workers who do not have a means of livelihood after they pass the working age and have to be dependent on family and society for their needs. The scheme is open to workers who make less than Rs 15000 per month and are not covered by other pension schemes like NPS.

Open to workers from ages 18-40, it guarantees a pension of Rs 3000 per month after attaining an age of 60 years. Under the scheme, the subscriber is required to pay a prescribed monthly contribution

amount and the Central Government provides an equal matching contribution. The person's contribution depends on the age he joins the scheme. Contributions can be as less as Rs 100 per month



depending on the age.

The maximum number of beneficiaries for the scheme hailed from Haryana at 6 lakh followed by Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh. ■

LOK SABHA PRODUCTIVITY REACHES 20 YEAR HIGH

The Lower House has been working for more than its scheduled time and has sat till midnight on two occasions to complete its legislative business.

The ongoing session of the 17th Lok Sabha has been the most productive in the last 20 years, with the Lower House registering 128% productivity till date, says think tank PRS Legislative Research.

The Lok Sabha, chaired by Speaker Shri Om Birla, has been working for more than its scheduled time and has sat till midnight on two occasions to complete its legislative business.

"This session, the Lok Sabha has been working for more than its scheduled time. Till July 16, 2019, the Lok Sabha's productivity is at 128% which is the highest for any session in the past 20 years," the PRS Legislative Research said.

Similarly, the productivity of the Rajya Sabha, where the Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led dispensation



lacks majority unlike the Lok Sabha, is also relatively high. The productivity of the Upper House was 98% till Tuesday, according to the PRS Legislative Research.

Productivity here means the number of hours the House actually functioned compared to the the number of hours officially earmarked for it to work.

The session started on June 17 and will conclude on July 26. ■ (PTI)

Functional routes under UDAN rises to 186

12 routes under the Regional Connectivity Scheme (or UdeDesh ka AamNaagrik /UDAN in Hindi) have recently become functional. This takes the total operational routes under UDAN to 186 (including 8 Tourism RCS routes) of the total 706 sanctioned Routes.

- The 12 routes with daily flight operations that commenced are:
- Kolkata (WB)- Allahabad (UP), Allahabad (UP)-Kolkata (WB),
- Allahabad (UP) - Raipur (CG), Raipur (CG) -Allahabad (UP), Gwalior (MP) - Bangalore (KA)
- Bangalore (KA) - Gwalior (MP), Kolkata (WB) -Gwalior (MP), Gwalior (MP)- Kolkata (WB)
- Mumbai (MH) - Belgaum(KA),Belgaum(KA)-Mumbai (MH), Mumbai (MH)- Durgapur(WB)

The Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) launched Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) - Ude Desh ka AamNagrik (UDAN) on 21.10.2016 to stimulate regional air connectivity and making air travel affordable to the masses. Since then 3 (Three) Round of biddings have been completed. The first RCS-UDAN flight was launched by Hon'ble Prime Minister on 27th April, 2017 at Shimla. 106 RCS Airports / Water aerodromes (76 Unserved, 20 Underserved & 10 Waterdromes) and 31 heliports have been identified for commencement of RCS flight connecting small cities in India. 706 RCS routes including 46 Tourism RCS routes have been awarded to 19 selected Airline operators under UDAN. RCS flights commenced from 40 RCS (23 Unserved & 17 Underserved) Airports and Durgapur is the latest airport on the map of RCS UDAN . ■

It is a comprehensive world-view which originated in India as a result of the profound insight of generations of wise men who are known as the 'Rishis'. It covers every spectrum of human life and its foundations are eternally sound and always relevant. It is from that rich philosophy that the great Indian culture evolved. Any truly nationalist movement can benefit from this all embracing philosophy. It is inclusive of spiritual as well as material progress of mankind.

Each has to be studied and understood correctly and in due proportion. Provision has to be made for the total development of each in order to ensure that a perfect man is evolved. This can be achieved only when the society provides the congenial climate. Man is not an isolated being nor can he evolve to his full stature in isolation. It is because of that the philosophy of Integral Humanism takes into account the whole gamut of circumstances necessary for the full growth of all the individuals. This includes primarily the society which is constituted by the basic unit – family, and also the nation and ultimately the entire humanity. Integral Humanism as a philosophy is pragmatic enough to deal with all the problems and demands of the present times. That is why it is called the “Yuga dharma”

Naturally it must lay down the guidelines for a practical restructuring of all the areas of human life. In today's situation, dominated by the Western

paradigm, this is a Herculean task. It may be comparatively easy to enunciate a philosophy, but to work out and apply it in the individual and collective life, requires collective thinking and action by the best minds of the country through ceaseless effort involving repeated trial and error. It should be stated to the credit of Deendayalji, that he has broken the path for this eventual transformation. It is up to us to earnestly follow up this philosophy through serious effort to its ultimate fulfillment.

History of India is the story of the most ancient civilization successfully overcoming threats and challenges of unparalleled magnitude and still continues vibrant enough to play the role of world leadership. Through all vicissitudes she has been able to maintain the thread of her cultural identity unbroken. The Vedic civilization still continues. This was possible because of her unique ability to combine tradition with modernity. The foundation of Indian culture is eternally relevant and universally valid. That is what is known as “Sanathana Dharma”. But whenever great changes take place and adaptation becomes necessary Indian genius has found it flexible enough to accept necessary adjustments

through reforms. Most of the reformers were saints and sages. Rishi mean men with intuition and far sight. “Eternal values for a changing society” has been our traditional method of reforming the society. That is how the concept of “Sanathana Dharma” and “Yuga Dharma” came into existence. “Ekatma Manava Darsan” is the “Yuga Dharma” for this age. The chief characteristics of “Ekatma Manava Darsan” can be broadly enumerated this.

(1) Unity of existence – ‘SARVAM KHALIDAM BRAHMA’

(2) Multiplicity and variety that we experience are only the varied expressions of this latent unity under different names and forms.

(3) Being the expression of one, multiplicity is interconnected and interdependent. They are not independent of each other – all relations whether inter human or between Man and Nature or between nations and nations should be on the basis of this interconnections and inter dependences. They should not be conflictual.

(4) The same is true about the various constituents that make up individuals and society. The principle of existence is mutual cooperation and coordination and not conflict and

contradiction. On the basis of this, every department of life, every discipline should be looked upon as part and parcel of one single whole and therefore mutually supporting and making up one whole.

(5) Science and spirituality should be viewed as two different approaches to realize the ultimate Truth. As such, there is no real conflict between the two. Consequently science and technology must complement spirituality and humanity. It is on the basis of this fundamental approach that all the areas of activities from the individual to the universal should be formulated. The motto can be well summarized in the words of Bhagavad Gita "Parasparam Bhavayanthaha Shreyaha Paramavapsyathe". When this principle is properly understood and honestly pursued it will lead humanity towards the goal of "Vasudhaiva kudumbakam".

But it is quite true that to give concrete shape to this sublime idea in the midst of the most complicated circumstances in which we live requires a lot of strenuous effort, unshakable determination, practical wisdom, infinite patience and perfect understanding and mutual cooperation among all who are committed to the idea of Integral Humanism. For humanity to survive there seems to be no other way. This is not an alternative paradigm but the only paradigm which is open to us.

Leaders of independent India, traumatized by partition and its legacy of problems took India in a direction quite different from that envisaged by her national geniuses, and which she legitimately deserved. They were unduly influenced by foreign models of ideologies. Though they spoke in terms of non alignment they leaned heavily on the side of Soviet model of socialism for economic development. Domestic policy

was aggressively anti-Hindu though they clothed it by the word "secularism". The net result was self aberration. It was to correct this aberration and give a genuinely national orientation that Integral humanism was conceived. It was a holistic philosophy covering all the areas of national life.

Mahatma Gandhi had popularized the concept of Rama Rajya; Vinoba Bhave was an ardent advocate of Sarvodaya. Integral Humanism largely resembled both these in broad details. Those were the days when there were many world thinkers who saw the danger ahead posed by the current Western model and emphasized the need for an alternate approach to capitalism and communism, which were not only materialistic but also promoted vulgar consumerism. They believed in gigantic mode of production – whether industrial or agricultural. Humanistic economic thinkers like Prof. Shoemaker, had started advocating "technology with human face" and "small is beautiful". But our first Prime Minister borrowed heavily from the Soviet model of gigantic industrialism and 'green revolution' in agriculture. Both were not only unsuitable to Indian conditions but also were fiercely opposed by Mahatma Gandhi whose 'brand name' they liberally exploited. It was in this context that Deendayal Upadhyaya propounded the concept of Integral Humanism in which the total development and well- being of Man were to be the goal of all economic and political activities.

As opposed to gigantism he advocated decentralized economic and political system where 'Man' could fully exercise his economic and political freedom through small scale industrial units and agricultural farms supported by the local bodies. It envisaged every home to be a centre of production of goods. In the field of agriculture, family- owned

plots of land were to become the units of intensive cultivation. Irrigation facilities were to be assured to every farm, so that agriculture will not solely depend on the monsoon. This would result in improved production, large scale employment and balanced development of rural and urban areas. The spirit of Swadeshi would become alive. Cultural values could be maintained. Self Government (Swaraj) would become a reality. Man's individuality will not be drowned in an ocean of urbanized chaos. Latest technologies available now could be eminently suitable for this kind of small scale, decentralized production. Such a model would also be in tune with the tradition, values and experience of India's vast population. In spite of all these favorable factors, unfortunately the Nehruvian model became the order of the day in independent India.

After the collapse of Communist model in 1990, our country was taken to the other extreme of economic liberalization where private capital and corporate bodies began to run the show. The need and relevance of a truly Indian model such as integral humanism was not seriously considered much less experimented. Now is the time for such a leadership to emerge who can think unblended by prejudices and harmful hangovers. They can launch a bold experiment on the basis of integral humanism as enunciated by saintly visionaries like Swami Vivekananda and Mahayogi Aurobindo, Gandhiji and Sri Gurujii with a comprehensive and practical vision. To embark upon such an indigenous model will be the true way of paying our debt to Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya who gave us the philosophy of Integration and who passed away prematurely. ■ **To be continued...**

He added, “Leaders like Shri Mange Ram Garg Ji are assets for any party. They work selflessly at the grassroots and touch the lives of several

people through various community service initiatives. The good work Shri Garg Ji did would continue to be remembered for years.”

BJP National President & Union Home Minister Shri Amit Shah, BJP Senior leader Shri LK Advani, BJP National Vice President Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan, General Secretary (Organisation) Shri BL Santhosh, Finance Minister Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman, Former External Affairs Minister Smt. Sushma Swaraj and Delhi BJP President Shri Manoj Tiwari also paid their last respects to Shri Garg.

Shri Shah said that Shri Garg selflessly worked for people throughout his life, adding that he served the people of Delhi from the time of the Jana Sangh and his sudden demise was a very big loss that could not be compensated. Shri Garg represented the Wazirpur Assembly constituency in the national capital between 2003 and 2008. PROPOSED AMENDMENTS WOULD FURTHER EMPOWER THE COUNTRY TO FIGHT TERROR: AMIT SHAH

On July 17 National Investigation Agency (Amendment) Bill, 2019 was passed in Rajya Sabha unanimously. While replying the debate on the legislation BJP National President & Union Home Minister Shri Amit Shah said that the proposed amendments would further empower the country to fight terror. Here, we are giving synopsis of the speech given by Union Home Minister Shri Amit Shah.

On the question raised on efficiency of NIA, I would like to say that if this House does not mould the credence of the NIA, then how will the NIA's credibility be created in the world. To attempt to undermine this agency, to bring down its efficiency before the world is not right. As far as NIA is concerned, I do not want to give much data. From 2014 to 2019, till 17.07.2019, the total registered cases are 195, out of 195 cases, the filing of charge sheets has been completed in 129 cases. In 44 cases, the culprits have been convicted in 41 cases. I do not believe that any agency in the world has worked more efficiently than this. Out of 44 cases, 41 have been convicted, and 184 accused have been proved guilty. I want to assure this House that wherever in the world there will be a crime of terrorism against the Indians, the NIA agency will be able to deal with it. The first challan was made on August 9, 2012 in the Samjhauta train explosion case, in 2013 another challan was made. At both the times we were not in the government. In the Samjhauta train explosion case seven people were apprehended. US agencies said that they had made explosion, later suddenly a case was made to link terrorism with a particular religion. Those who died in Samjhauta Express, their widows and orphans also have human rights. They have not got justice. There was a time when the government, prosecution and law officers used to conspire in the same room. There

is no wrong case against anyone in the government of Narendra Modi. Our government does not run on the basis of the Political Mandate. I want to assure that the government will not allow misuse of this law. Today, we do not have any legal right to take action against terrorist activities occurred in foreign country in which Indians were attacked. Pakistan has signed the treaty, but it has not made the law. An incident occurred in Uri, CRPF was attacked in Pulwama. We also did surgical strike, air strike, and we dared to



answer by entering the house. In Pakistan also, it will have to make this law sometime or other. It is a law that will send a message across the world that what is the intention of both Houses of India. All these messages are going to be from this law. I want to request all members of the House that this amendment should be passed unanimously. ■



MODI GOVERNMENT 2.0 COMPLETES FIFTH YEAR

PRAKASH JAVADEKAR PRESENTS REPORT CARD

A SEPARATE TV CHANNEL FOR START-UPS WILL SOON BE STARTED

to all farmers. MSP for several crops has doubled, and in some cases trebled in comparison to 2014 rates. 10,000 Farmers Producer Organization are being formed. Changes in Labour Code will benefit 40 crore informal sector workers through wage and labour security. For the first time, pension has been provided for traders. The Minister also highlighted the reduction in ESI contribution rates, for both employees and employers.

The Minister highlighted the steps taken to boost investment in the country. Rs 70,000 crore has been provided for Public Sector Banks (PSB) recapitalisation. India is striving towards becoming a 5 trillion dollar economy. A separate TV channel for start-ups will soon be started. Non-functional financial up gradation has been provided to Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) officers.

He said that in the next 5 years, Rs. 100 lakh crore will be invested towards development of

infrastructure. He highlighted that the government is working in mission mode to comprehensively address water-related issues, which is evident through the formation of Jal Shakti Mantralaya.

He also highlighted the success of steps taken by the Government in reducing the impact of separatists in Jammu & Kashmir. He added that India has emerged as a global leader through BIMSTEC and G-20, while highlighting the significance of the visit of Prime Minister to Maldives and Sri Lanka.

Shri Javadekar expressed confidence in the successful launch of Chandrayaan-2 and added

that India's manned mission to space, Gaganyaan, will be launched in 2022.

He also highlighted the massive action taken against corruption in bureaucracy. Steps have been taken to strengthen action against economic offenders. A Bill is being brought to act against Ponzi schemes.

Shri Javadekar also talked about the decisiveness of government in safeguarding children against sexual crimes through amendments to POCSO Act. He also talked about steps taken to reform medical education in the country and to ensure transparency, accountability and quality in the governance of medical education in the country.

The Minister stressed that making India a 5 trillion dollar economy is no more just a dream but a roadmap towards achieving it has been laid down in these fifty days. ■

as he reeled out the achievements of the first five years of the Modi government and what it was doing now. "The BJP aims at Congress mukt-Bharat and BJP yukt-Bharat. Congress mukt-Bharat means corruption-free India and commission-free India," he said.

"By saying Congress-mukt, we don't mean the party as such. BJP-yukt means development-oriented. It means focus on service and development and work at the grassroots level and not work for self-promotion," Shri Nadda added.

"Modi's victories in 2014 and 2019 are a rejection of the vote bank and caste politics... People have rejected (vote bank ke mathadheesh) those who lorded over votebanks," he said giving the example of the SP and the BSP in Uttar Pradesh. He asked BJP workers to "look globally, act locally" and asserted that it should be the motto of BJP workers.

Speaking about the pre-2014 India, he said, "India's image abroad was that of a corrupt country which suffered foreign policy paralysis and lacked direction".

Parliament Passes the Protection of Human Rights (Amendment) Bill, 2019 unanimously

The Rajya Sabha passed the Protection of Human Rights (Amendment) Bill, 2019 unanimously on July 22 after a fervent appeal from the Union Minister for Home Affairs, Shri Amit Shah.

Clarifying on the transparency of the selection process for the Chairperson and Members of the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), Shri Amit Shah said that the selection committee was a diverse one, containing opposition leaders from both the houses in addition to the Prime Minister; Union Home Minister; Speaker, Lok Sabha and Deputy Chairperson, Rajya Sabha. A decision of such a vast and diverse committee should not be seen with distrust, said Shri Shah.

Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Shri Nityanand Rai said that the Amendment had been prepared based on the challenges faced in the last thirteen years, and will increase the efficiency of the Commission. He also said that the Modi Government is committed to the independence and autonomy of the Commission.

The Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993 was enacted to provide for the constitution of a National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), the State Human Rights Commission (SHRC) and the Human Rights Courts for protection of human rights.

The NHRC has proposed certain amendments to the Act to address the concerns raised at certain global platforms. Besides this, certain State Governments have also proposed for amendment of the Act, as they have been facing difficulties in finding suitable candidates to the post of Chairperson of the respective State Commissions owing to the existing eligibility criteria to the said post.

The Protection of Human Rights (Amendment)

Bill, 2019, inter alia, provides

that a person who has been a Judge of the Supreme Court is also made eligible to be appointed as Chairperson of the Commission in addition to the person who has been the Chief Justice of India;

to increase the Members of the Commission from two to three of which, one shall be a woman;

to include Chairperson of the National Commission for Backward Classes, Chairperson of the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights and the Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities as deemed Members of the Commission;

to reduce the term of the Chairperson and Members



of the Commission and the State Commissions from five to three years and shall be eligible for re-appointment;

to provide that a person who has been a Judge of a High Court is also made eligible to be appointed as Chairperson of the State Commission in addition to the person who has been the Chief Justice of the High Court; and,

to confer upon State Commissions, the functions relating to human rights being discharged by the Union territories, other than the Union territory of Delhi, which will be dealt with by the Commission. ■

Rs. 1600 crore expenditure approved to enhance Infrastructure in Arunachal Pradesh

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has approved the expenditure on pre-investment activities and various clearances for Dibang Multipurpose Project (MPP) in Arunachal Pradesh for an amount of Rs. 1600 crore.

The estimated total cost of Project is Rs. 28080.35 including IDC & FC of Rs 3974.95 crore at Jun'18 price level. The estimated completion period for the project shall be nine years from receipt of Government sanction.

The project shall generate 2880MW (12x240MW) power to produce 11223MU of energy in a 90%



dependable year. This is the largest ever Hydro Electric Projects to be constructed in India. The dam is 278 metres high and will be the highest dam in India once completed. ■

SAI implemented various Sports Promotional Schemes through its 273 sports centres in various States

Sports Authority of India (SAI) has implemented the various Sports Promotional Schemes through its 273 sports centres located in various States of the country. These schemes cover the rural areas in the country including those in the state of Odisha. Presently 14236 talented sports persons including 8698 (residential trainees) are being trained in 27 sports disciplines. Further, 1178 sporting talents in Khelo India School Games, 2018 and 2437 sporting talents in Khelo India Youth Games, 2019 have been selected under Khelo India scheme for further training to excel in various National/ International competitions. 'Sports' being a State subject, the responsibility of promotion of sports, including creation of sports infrastructure, rests with State/ Union Territory Governments. Central Government supplements the efforts of State/ Union Territory Governments by providing assistance to training facilities, coaching and financial support to sportspersons under various schemes such as Khelo India, schemes ran by Sports Authority of India (SAI) centres and Assistance to National Sports Federations (NSFs).

Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) provide funds to SAI for implementation of schemes for promotion of sports through training centres established by SAI. State and Union Territory (UT) wise funds are not provided to SAI. Information related to allocation of funds under various SAI sports promotional schemes is at Annexure-I. The locations of the SAI centres through which the SAI schemes are implemented is at Annexure-II. Further the funds are released to States/ UTs to bridge the gaps for development of sports infrastructure under Khelo India Scheme. The position of funds provided to various States under Khelo India Scheme during the last three years is at Annexure-III and the details of the projects sanctioned during last three years are at Annexure-IV.

Sports Promotional Schemes implemented by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports cater to the entire population of the country including the tribal people.

This information was given by the Minister of State (I/C) Shri Kiren Rijiju in a written reply in the Lok Sabha on July 18. ■

PM NARENDRA MODI WELCOMES ICJ VERDICT IN KULBHUSHAN JADHAV CASE

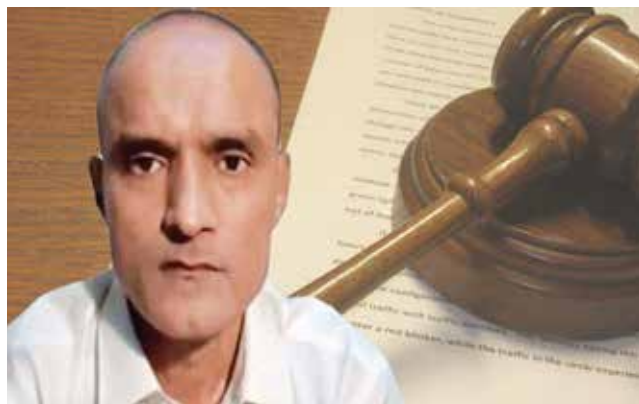
The ICJ on July 17 ordered Pakistan to undertake an “effective review and reconsideration” of the conviction and sentence of Jadhav and also to grant consular access to India without further delay.

India on July 18 had asked Pakistan to “act immediately” on the ICJ verdict and grant consular access to Jadhav.

Acting on the order of International Court of Justice ruling, Pakistan has agreed to grant consular access to Kulbhushan Jadhav “according to Pakistani laws”, the Pakistan Foreign Office said.

In a statement released post midnight, the Pakistan foreign office said it has informed Jadhav of his rights to consular access under the Vienna Convention.

The ICJ has directed Pakistan for continued stay on the death sentence of Jadhav and to provide him consular access. Pakistan had refused to allow Indian officials to meet Jadhav ever since his “arrest” in March 2016 for alleged espionage. India had approached the ICJ after he was in April 2017 sentenced to death by a military court. Reading out the much-awaited verdict in the case, the UN Court said that Pakistan had violated the Vienna Convention by denying India



consular access to Jadhav. The international court, which ruled in favour of India by 15 votes to 1, also directed Pakistan to review the death penalty given to Jadhav in 2017 by its military court.

When verdict came on July 17 Prime Minister took to Twitter and said, “We welcome today’s verdict in the ICJ. Truth and justice have prevailed. Congratulations to the ICJ for a verdict based on extensive study of facts. I am sure Kulbhushan Jadhav will get justice.”

“Our Government will always work for the safety and welfare of every Indian,” the PM assured. ■

Boost to Rail connectivity in Assam

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has given its approval on July 17 to construct the New Bongaigaon and Agthori via Rangiya doubling (142.97 km) of Northeast Frontier Railway in Assam with an estimated cost of Rs. 2042.51 crore. The project will be completed by 2022-23 and will be executed by Construction Organization of Northeast Frontier Railway. ■

'MAKE IN INDIA' Initiatives in Steel Sector

Domestically Manufactured Iron and Steel Products Policy has been notified on 8th May, 2017 and subsequently revised on 29th May, 2019 with a objective to encourage Make in India for steel and steel products. Under this Policy, Central Government Ministries / Departments and their agencies are required to mandatorily procure only those steel items which are manufactured in India.

Although Steel is a deregulated sector. The following steps have been taken by the Government to curtail steel imports and boost steel exports:-

- Domestically Manufactured Iron and Steel Products Policy, 2017 has been revised on 29.5.2019. It has reduced threshold minimum value of contract from Rs 50 Cr to Rs 25 Cr. It now includes Engineering, Procurement and Construction (EPC) contracts within the ambit of this policy apart from other things thereby promoting consumption of domestically

produced goods and reducing imports.

- Government has notified 53 Steel and Steel Product (Quality Control) Orders which is applicable for both domestic productions as well as imports. The Steel Quality Control Order are implemented in the public interest for protection of human, animal and plant, safety of environment, prevention of unfair trade practices and national security.
- In order to protect the domestic industry from unfair external competition, appropriate trade measures such as anti-dumping duties and countervailing duties have been imposed.
- Government has several schemes for promoting exports, such as MEIS, Market Access initiative, Export Promotion Council etc.

This information was given by the Union Minister for steel Shri Dharmendra Pradhan in a written reply in the Lok Sabha on July 22. ■

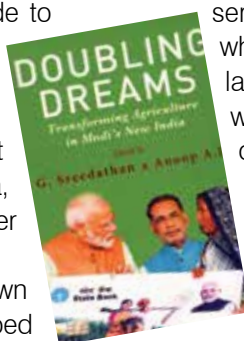
Doubling Dreams: Transforming Agriculture in Modi's New India'
